

Classes of 1988-90 wins alumni tournament

Members of the classes of 1988 to 1990 emerged victorious in the sixth annual Heppner High School alumni tournament held Dec. 31 to Jan. 2. Organizer Stuart Dick, Hermiston, said that this was the first year a class younger than 1985 has won the tourney.

Bobby Krein was the three-point champion for the third year in a row and Dana Reid, the women's free throw winner.

Dick said that a highlight of the event was the alumni banquet

which was new to the tournament this year. The banquet drew over 100 people. Dick said that alumnus and former student body president, Diane Holland Cassins added a "very moving" touch to the dinner. Holland, who has Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis commonly known as Lou Gehrig Disease, and multiple sclerosis and cannot speak but is fully coherent, wrote a letter to the group which was read by Dorian Forrar. Holland has been a faithful supporter of the tourna-

ment, said Dick. John Van Winkle, class of 1968, shared some amusing anecdotes. Dave Hanna and the Elks Club crew put on a "tremendous" dinner, added Dick. John McCabe was dinner chairman.

Honored guests were "super fans", Doug Gunderson, Jean Strange, John and Pat Edmundson, Archie and Diana Ball and Raymond and Deena Reid, who received a free dinner and a T-shirt.

Dana Reid, chairman of the women's events, was the "driving force behind the tournament," said Dick. "She did a super job." Kenny Eckman did a "wonderful job" organizing the equipment and Rick and Susan Johnston were "great promoters", added Dick.

The tournament grossed around \$2,500, which says Dick, is comparable to previous years. Proceeds from last year's tournament sponsored a basketball clinic for area youth, in addition to the Hilda Yocom Scholarship, Mike Currin Scholarship and the Booster Club trophy case.

The tournament this year was dedicated to alumnus Donnie Lott, who recently passed away.

Around 80 men and 40 women participated in this year's games, with around a third coming from out of town. "It was a super year for us," concluded Dick. "Everything went well. It was one of the best years we've had. Reid echoed that sentiment saying, "It was a real big success. It was a lot of fun and everyone there enjoyed themselves."

The Morrow County District Attorney's office at the courthouse in Heppner reports handling the following business during the past week:

Carlos Cipriano Mendoza, Irrigon, was convicted Jan. 3 of Assault IV. Mendoza received 180 days in jail, suspended, with a \$587 fine. The conviction stems from a Jan. 1 incident with Mendoza's ex-girlfriend in which Mendoza grabbed the girlfriend and shoved her into a car;

Henry Burl Stickler, formerly of the Boardman area, was arrested by Oregon State Police on Dec. 31. Stickler was charged with Driving While Revoked and Giving False Information to a police officer. Stickler was stopped on I-84 and allegedly gave a false name to the officer. When the officer determined Stickler's true name, a check determined that he was wanted in Linn County for similar charges and a probation revocation;
