By 10 a.m. they were in Portland, divided into groups and ready to get to

work. On Monday the groups worked at various service organizations, including the Blanchet House, Loaves and Fishes, Outreach Ministries, Recovery Inn and The Sister of the Road Cafe. Their duties were mainly serving and delivering meals as well as cleaning and office work.

After an overnight stay at the First Congregational Church near Broadway, the Ione youth split into two groups. On Tuesday one group helped serve lunch at the Blanchet House and the other washed walls at the Greenhouse Youth Shelter before starting for home.
