The following letter was written to Larry Gildea, attorney for Pioneer Resources, representing the buyers of the Kinzua Mills.

Dear Sir:  
This letter is a protest to the potential closure of the Kinzua Lumber Co. mill in Heppner, Oregon.

I was shocked to hear the news of the sale and impending shutdown of a very profitable business that has been the support of scores of families and the very life-blood of a very special small community, for a long, long time. My interest is not that of a mere "outsider" witnessing this tragedy. I was born in Heppner, raised nearby, and own farmland locally, so I do have personal ties. I am adding my support to the public outcry that a terrible disservice may be about to happen.

In these days of the en-

vironmental awareness, our most powerful enemies are greed and the short-sighted people who feed that greed at the expense of others. To strip the timber resources, (with no management plan) to sell raw timber for export, or to destroy the industrial resources of a community is criminal. I pray that as a decision maker in this venture, Pioneer Resources will not fall into that category.

Which one of the purchasers has the moral courage to rethink his choices, stand up to this travesty and say "no, this is wrong."

Please encourage each other to keep the mill operating. Those loyal workers deserve to keep their jobs, their homes and their community.
