

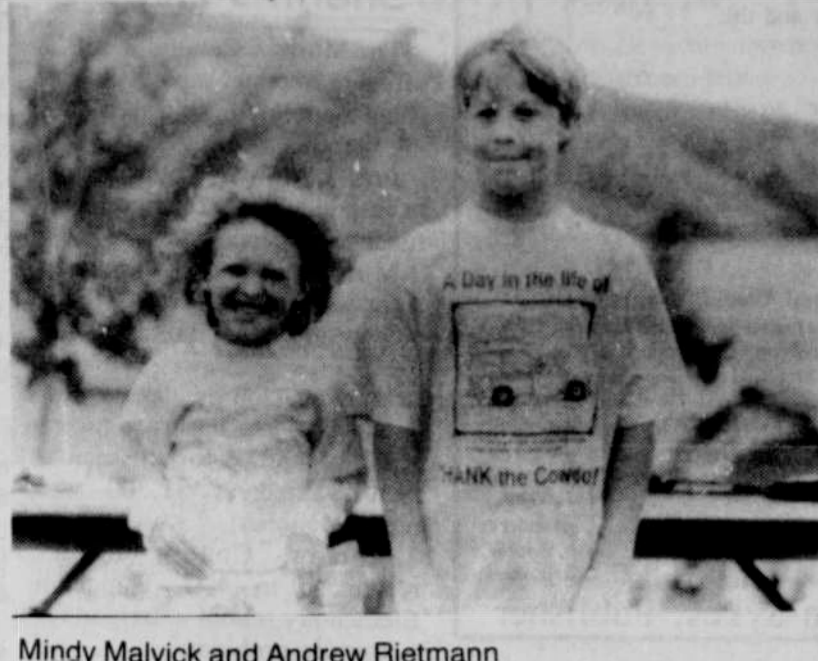
## Good turnout for Fishing Derby

### FDA Proposes Herpes Medicine Become OTC

According to an announcement from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the manufacturer of acyclovir (Zovirax) has requested that this drug be moved from prescription-only to OTC (over-the-counter) status. The FDA reviewed the request in a public hearing in May and indicated that it is accepting written comments on the proposal until June 20.

The request for OTC Zovirax is for the 200 mg oral capsule. If approved, Zovirax would become the first OTC medicine in the United States available for the treatment of a sexually transmitted disease. It would also be the first antimicrobial (infection fighter) medicine for systemic use given approval as a nonprescription drug. The indicated OTC use of Zovirax capsules would be for the suppressive management of recurring genital herpes infection. Since the virus which causes herpes remains in the body after the infection goes away, many people have episodes of recurring herpes infections.

According to a report in a recent issue of *Journal of the American Medical Association*, potential opposition to OTC Zovirax may be based on (1) the inability of many individuals to diagnose genital herpes without the aid of a physician, (2) potential misuse of the drug for unapproved uses, and (3) safety factors such as the potential for adverse effects of the drug in the unborn.
