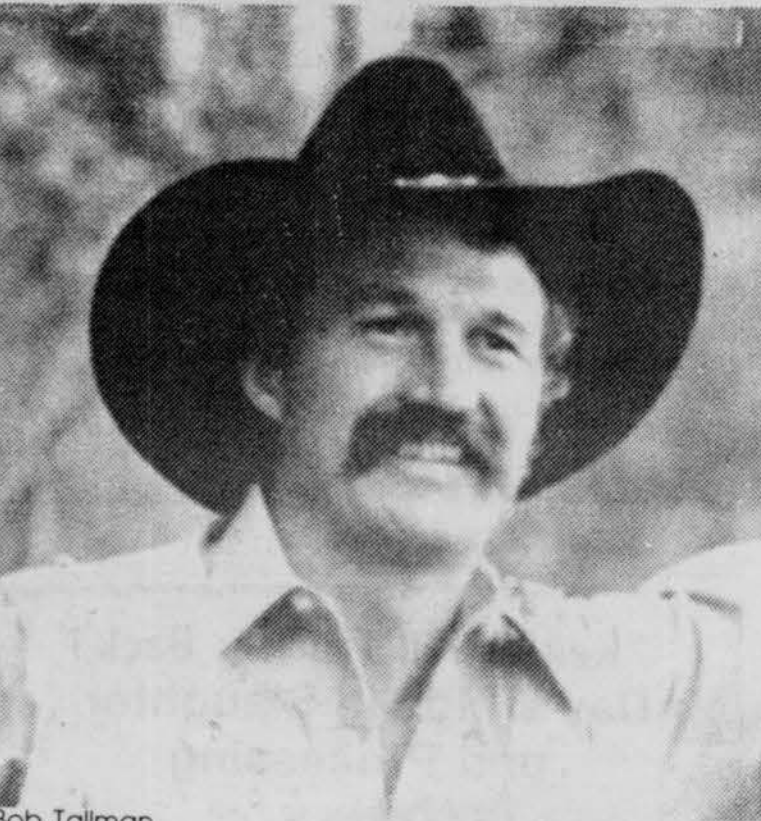

They have appeared with top recording artist such as Mary Chapin-Carpenter, The Desert Rose Band, Collin Ray, and Hal Ketchum. Kate's sparkling command of the stage and steamy, gutsy interpretations of today's country songs are balanced by John's high, lonesome tenor and wry wit. Their award winning repertoire of original songs and country favorites allows the band to be at home in concert halls and festival stages.

Tallman, the PRCA's announcer of the year in 1982 and '87, announces more than 200 rodeos each year. He has hosted several rodeo-oriented radio programs, and has spent substantial time in front of a TV camera, as well. He holds a bachelor's degree in agriculture economics, and still raises cattle on his ranch in Baker City with his wife, Kristen, and daughter, Nicole.
