An explanation of the Oregon Political Tax Credit

Oregon tax law allows each taxpayer to give up to \$50 per individual or \$100 per married couple to the political action committee of their choice. You simply send a check to Stop Special Rights PAC and then subtract the total amount from your income tax debt on your 1994 Oregon tax form. If you have overpaid through withholding, your refund will be increased by the amount of your donation. This is money you cannot keep or give to charity. If you don't give it to a PAC like SSR-PAC, you will simply pay it in taxes. It costs you nothing to use your tax credit, but not using it could cost SSR-PAC the election.
