**Delwin Orville Nelson**

Funeral services were held for Delwin Orville Nelson Wednesday, Sept. 21 at Spencer, Libby & Powell Funeral Home. Interment with veteran's rites followed at Parklawn Cemetery.

Nelson, 77, a resident a resident of The Dalles, died at The Dalles Medical Center on Sept. 19, 1994.

A former Morrow County resident, he was born Dec. 25, 1916 at Pomeroy, Wash., the oldest of two sons of Guy and Hazel (Bosley) Nelson. He grew up and graduated from high school at Walla Walla, WA. in 1937.

He was in the Washington National Guard from 1934 to 1938. He then served in the U.S. Marine Corps during World War II. Following the war he lived at Walla Walla for several years before moving to the Lexington area to farm.

He and Marvin, Don and Terry Tucker started Morrow County Produce Company in 1970.

In the mid 1970s he moved to Heppner and had a small cattle ranch. He served as Morrow County Judge from July 1977 to October 1979 when he moved to The Dalles. He worked for McClaskey Orchards and the Mt. Hood Athletic Club for a number of years and then at Safeway as a courtesy clerk.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Echo, having served as Past Master; Shriners, life member of Walla Walla Elks Lodge; Morrow County School Board; Morrow County Grain Growers (past president and board of directors) and enjoyed traveling, fishing and bowling.

He married Delpha L. Piper on June 11, 1939 at Walla Walla. He later married Cherry Hermann on Dec. 13, 1980.

Survivors include his wife, Cherry, The Dalles; a daughter and her husband Phyllis Jean and Robin Hyder of Portland; step daughters Donna Kay Hermann and Sandra Lee Hermann, both of The Dalles; four grandchildren, Brian Kroll and his wife Shelley; Kimberly Hyder, Sarah Hermann and Katie Baker and a brother Kenneth Nelson of Hermiston.

Survivors include a daughter Lorraine Brosnan of Heppner; sons, Ken of Pendleton, Fred of Heppner, and Gary of Mountain Home, Idaho; 11 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. Four sisters and a brother, died earlier.
