### School board disappointed by loss of bond measure

Morrow County School Board Chairman Marcia Kemp says that the recent defeat of the school bond issue for construction and remodeling of classrooms is "extremely disappointing". The bond measure was defeated by 59 votes, 1339 to 1280, in the special election held Tuesday, Sept. 20. Kemp said that the board will meet in regular session October 10 at Heppner High School to

discuss their options. Kemp says that the bond measure may have been defeated because of public misconception. The bond issue was solely for construction and remodeling, not for teacher pay hikes and she says, the schools in the north end of the county are genuinely overcrowded. "The north end classrooms are bursting at the seams," said Kemp. "They have been for years. They don't have a library, it's been turned into classrooms; they don't have an art room, it's been turned into a classroom and the art teacher has to come around to each room with a cart. Every little cubby hole has been turned into a classroom."

defeated, Heppner seventh and eighth graders would not be moved to the high school next year. "This is not the case," said Kemp, who added that the smaller student population in the south end will result in the cut of six teaching positions and the necessity of the seventh and eighth grade move to the high school. Kemp also said that although the board earlier believed that they could have high schools at both Boardman and Irrigon, there is just not enough money to do so, especially to provide teachers and technology. Kemp says that because the schools are required to comply with the disabilities act, and remodel schools to accommodate disabled children, she fears that other programs, such as food service, sports, art and music will have to be cut if a bond levy is not passed. "We are required to do this," said Kemp. "And the money has to come out of regular budget."

Kemp said that the people in the south end of the county, with a smaller student population, and used to spacious rooms and hallways, don't fully realize the conditions in the north end. Kemp said that some people may have gotten the impression that if the bond issue was

### Contact crop insurance agents by Sept. 30

Because of changes in the sign-up date for Federal Crop Insurance, winter wheat growers need to contact their crop insurance agents before the wheat sales' closing date, set at September 30 for the 1995 crop year.

According to a press release from the Oregon Wheat Growers League, growers should discuss with their agents the

terms of the small grains provisions for the 1995 crop year, with emphasis on the sales closing date, the standard policy and winter damage options 'A' and 'B'. According to the release, there are significant differences between the two options. Growers should also review with their agents the winter wheat crop planting dates.

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
