In The Service

Navy Petty Officer 3rd Class Shawn M. Hams, is currently halfway through a six-month deployment to the Mediterranean Sea and Indian Ocean aboard the amphibious assault ship USS Guam.

Hams is one of the 2,000 sailors and 2,200 marines of the four ship USS Guam Amphibious Ready Group, which departed Norfolk, VA., in May. Since then, Hams has traveled to England and France for the 50th anniversary of D-Day, to the Adriatic Sea off Bosnia and most recently, to Somalia in the Indian Ocean.

Hams visited Haifa, Israel, where sailors and marines from USS Guam formed a choir and sang at a home for handicapped children.

Off the coast of Kenya Hams participated in an amphibious training exercise, which allowed the sailors and marines to sharpen their skills as well as help the local population. In the village of Kipini, USS Guam sailors and marines delivered school supplies, medicine and clothing.

The Navy and Marine Corps team is designed to operate overseas and respond quickly when needed. Whether delivering humanitarian assistance, cargo or troops from the sea, these highly-trained naval forces provide a unique crisis-response option, which can be withdrawn quickly when no longer needed, said a press release.

Hams is the son of Wayne and Dianna Hams, of Ione. He joined the Navy in May 1992.

CRP payments authorized

\$5.4 million in 1994 Conservation Reserve annual payments have been authorized to be made starting Oct 4, according to Skip Matthews, county executive director for the Morrow County ASCS,

"The local office processes these payments which takes three to five days, so producers should expect to receive their annual rental payments sometime next week," Matthews said. There are 110,964 acres enrolled in USDA's CRP program in Morrow County. The program removes highly erodible land from production in return for an annual payment, said Matthews.
