Certificate 64173, in the name of Edward Burl Wattenberger, Jr., includes a right limited to 2.53 cubic foot per second from Butter Creek, with priority dates of 1872, 1890 and 1896 for irrigation of 127.5 acres.

The point of diversion, among others, for this right is in the NW 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 3, T 1 N, R 27 E, WM; 370' South and 300' East from the N 1/4 corner, Section 3.

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion to the NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 3, T 1 N, R 27 E, WM; 3465' South and 845' East from the N corner, Section 3.

PROPOSES SURFACING OF FOREST SERVICE ROADS

The Heppner Ranger District of the Umatilla National Forest is currently conducting analysis for the proposed Rock Surfacing of Roads Project. This project is located in Wheeler County south of Collins Butte and would remove approximately 700 cubic yards of rock from the source. Rock would be placed on open roads which access private lands, 2500130, 2500131, and 2500133. Due to soil conditions in this area, these roads have become impassable to travel. Private land owners have requested permission to acquire rock from Forest Service sources to improve access to their land and reduce rutting of the road surface during periods of wet weather.
