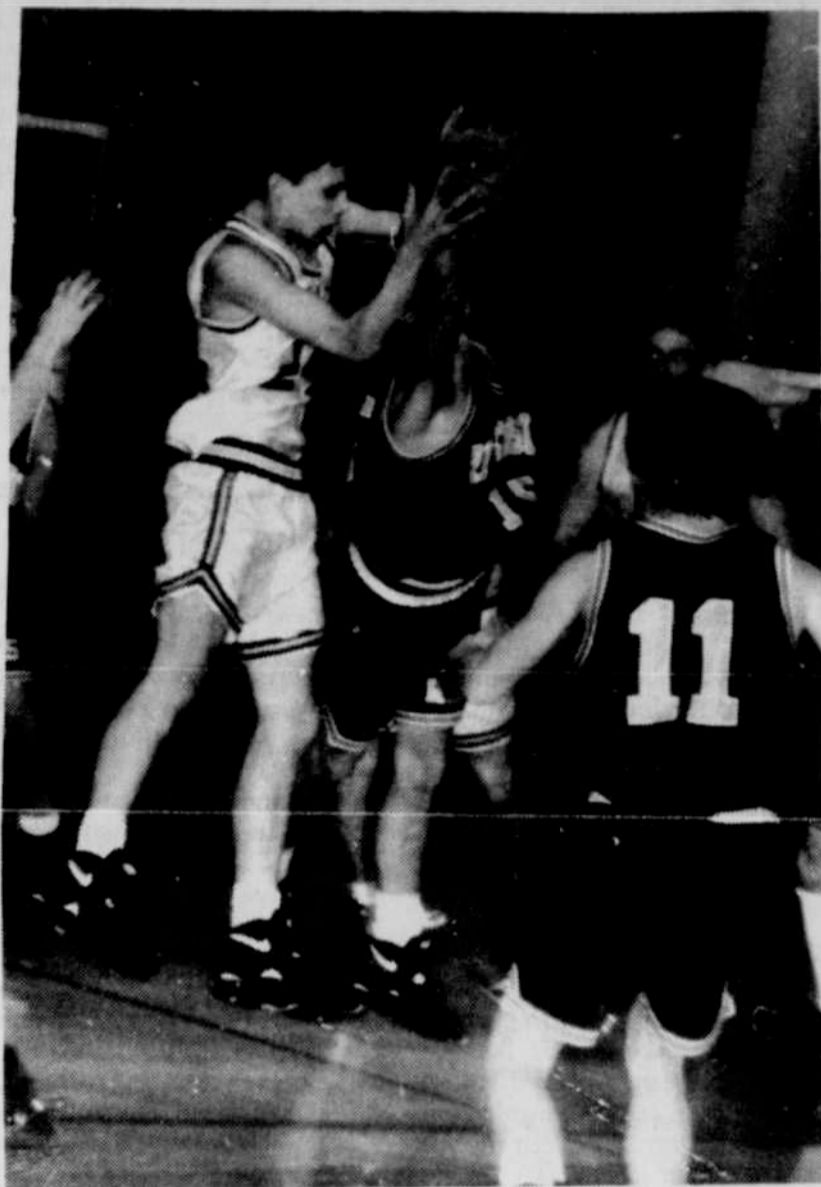

It looked like the start of a blowout when the Riverside Pirates jumped on top of Heppner 12-4 in the first quarter, last Saturday night Dec. 10 in Heppner. But a strong third period pulled it out for the Mustangs who came away with a 49-40 win over their cross-county rivals.

The Pirates' 6 foot nine-inch center Aaron Keizur racked up seven of his game-high 15 points in the first quarter, but the Mustang defense toughened up, holding Keizur's scoring down for the remainder of the game.

The Mustang offense came alive in the third period when Heppner litt up the scoreboard with 20 points to Riverside's eight, putting the Mustangs up for the first time, 34-31.

Heppner's leading scorer, Trent Hughes, popped in two three pointers, and Chris Sykes added six points in the third to

lead the scoring surge. Hughes ended with a total of 12 points and Sykes with 10.

Other scoring totals were: Eric Schonbachler 9; Brent Wright 6; Chris Dickenson 5; Dan Burnside 3; and Chad Skroch and Shawn Hisler 2 each.

The Mustangs continue with non-league play Friday when they face off against the Mac-High Pioneers at home, and then travel to Riverside Saturday, and back at home against Ione next Tuesday.
