Rusty Estes named fire chief

Twenty-year fire department veteran Rusty Estes was named Heppner Volunteer Fire Chief at the regular Heppner City Council meeting Monday evening, Dec. 13.

Retiring fire chief Forrie Burkenbine was honored for his 28 years of service in that position and was presented a plaque by Heppner Mayor Bob Jepsen. Jepsen said he had researched the meeting in which Burkenbine was appointed and said that Burkenbine agreed to take the position "temporarily", until "something else could be worked out". Mayor at the January 1967 city council meeting was W.C. Rosewall. City attorney was Bob Abrams, now a judge in Pendleton, and Jerry Sweeney had been sworn in as a council member. Elaine George was recording secretary and Bill Collins was also a councilmember. According to Jepsen, Bill Farrah and Clyde Allstott (councilmember David

Allstott's father, and now Estes' father-in-law) had also been considered for the fire chief position but they were out of town. Howard Bryant was contacted, but was not at home, and his wife reportedly said that he would not be interested.

Burkenbine said that Estes joined the force as a Heppner High School student under a cadet program. "This is my lifelong dream," commented Estes on his appointment. He was voted chief by his fellow firemen and appointed by the Heppner City Council.

City Councilmembers Dave Allstott and Dave Pranger were honored for their service on the council. Both are stepping down. Allstott has served since May of 1989 and Pranger since Jan. of 1993.

Tim Van Cleave and Skip Matthews will be sworn in as new councilmembers at the January council meeting.
