Classes on the agenda for the month of January include:

Woodworking, taught by Dave Fowler at Heppner High School. This class will begin Jan. 10 and will not be offered in the spring term. Cost of the class is \$35 plus a \$15 lab fee payable to the instructor.

Going into Business For Yourself will be offered at the school district office in Lexington on two consecutive Wednesdays beginning January 25.
