BALLOT TITLE  
GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND AUTHORIZATION QUESTION:

Shall the District be authorized to contract general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$975,000? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of Article XI, Section 11b of the Oregon Constitution.

PURPOSE:  
This measure, if approved, would authorize the District to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$975,000. Bond proceeds would be used to construct, furnish and equip the park district's swimming pool, therapy and fitness complex and to pay all costs incidental thereto. The bonds would mature over a period not to exceed 20 years. No bonds will be sold unless the voters of the District also approve the three year serial tax operating levy submitted this date.

WILLOW CREEK PARK DISTRICT  
BALLOT TITLE  
THREE YEAR OPERATING SERIAL TAX LEVY QUESTION:

Shall the District levy \$36,000 for three years outside the tax base for operating purposes beginning in 1995-1996?

PURPOSE:  
This measure, if approved, would authorize the Willow Creek Park District to levy taxes serially outside of the 6% limitation imposed by Section 11, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution, for a three year period, in the amount of \$36,000 each fiscal year, commencing July 1, 1995 for the 1995-1996 fiscal year and ending on June 30, 1998, for the 1997-1998 fiscal year, which would result in a total amount for the three year period of \$108,000, to provide funds for the operation and maintenance of the District's swimming pool complex. The tax levy is subject to the limits of Article XI, Section 11b of the Oregon Constitution and the taxes levied will be used for District governmental purposes. This measure would reduce property tax collections for other units of local government.

PUBLIC NOTICE AND NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Morrow County is eligible to apply for a 1995 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) from the Oregon Economic Development Department.

Community Development Block Grant funds come from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development through the Oregon Economic Development Department. The state will accept applications in early February 1995 for community facilities, handicapped accessibility, housing rehabilitation and technical assistance projects. Applications for public works projects are taken all year.

Approximately \$16 million will be awarded to Oregon nonmetropolitan cities and counties in 1995. The most any city or county can receive will be up to \$750,000 for a construction project and/or \$10,000 for a technical assistance grant.

A public hearing will be held by the Morrow County Court at 1:30 p.m. on January 18, 1995 in the Mental Health Conference Room at 101 Boardman Avenue, Boardman, Oregon.

The purpose of this hearing is for the Morrow County Court to obtain citizen views and to respond to proposals and questions about:

- \* Community development and housing needs, especially the needs of low and moderate income persons, as well as other needs in the community that might be assisted with a Community Development Block Grant project.
- \* The performance of Morrow County in carrying out its community development responsibilities.

Written comments are also welcome and must be received by January 17, 1995 at 100 Court Street, Heppner, Oregon 97836. Both oral and written comments will be considered by the Morrow County Court in deciding whether to apply.

A second public hearing will be held prior to completion of an application for a specific project.
