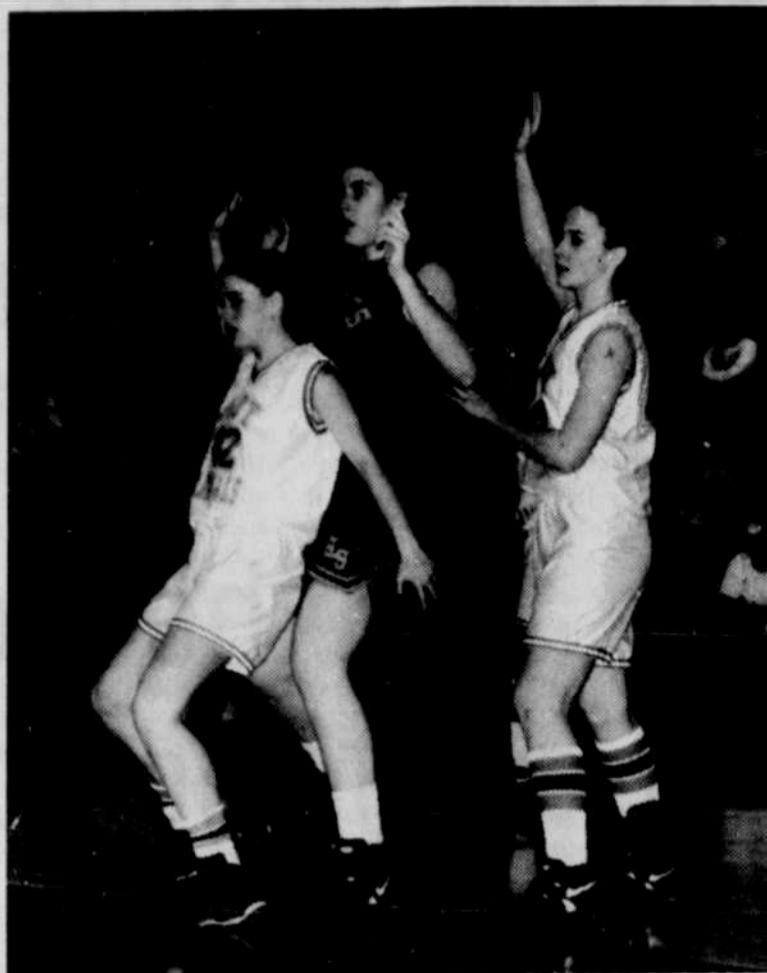

lone girls double team 6 ft. 3 Jenny mowe. powers won the opening game 57-52.

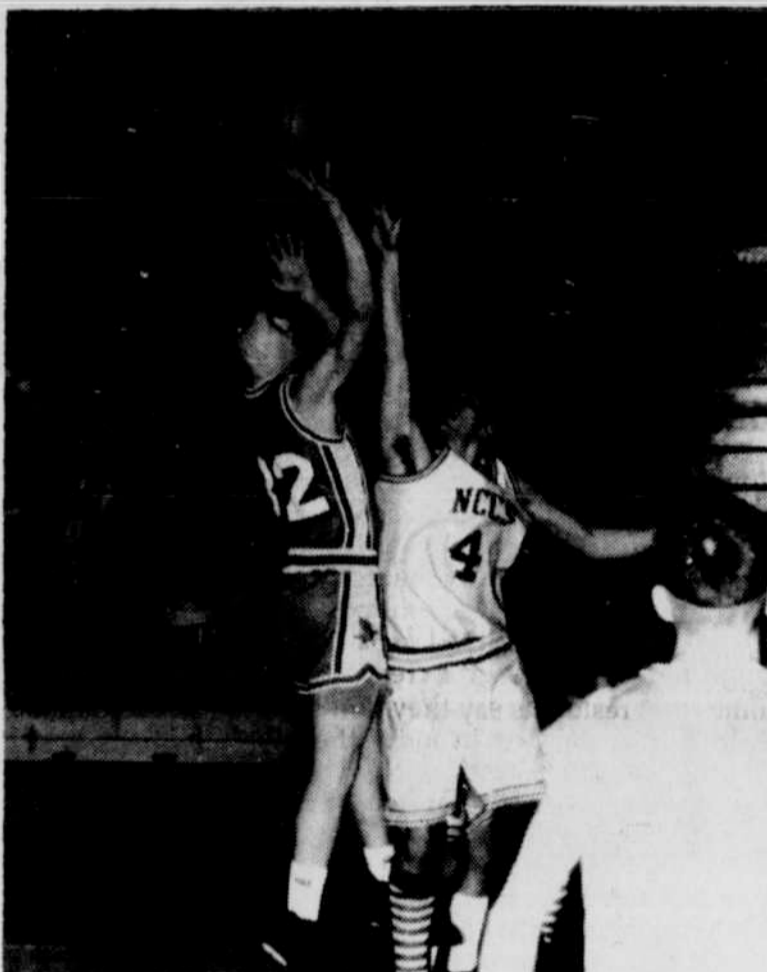

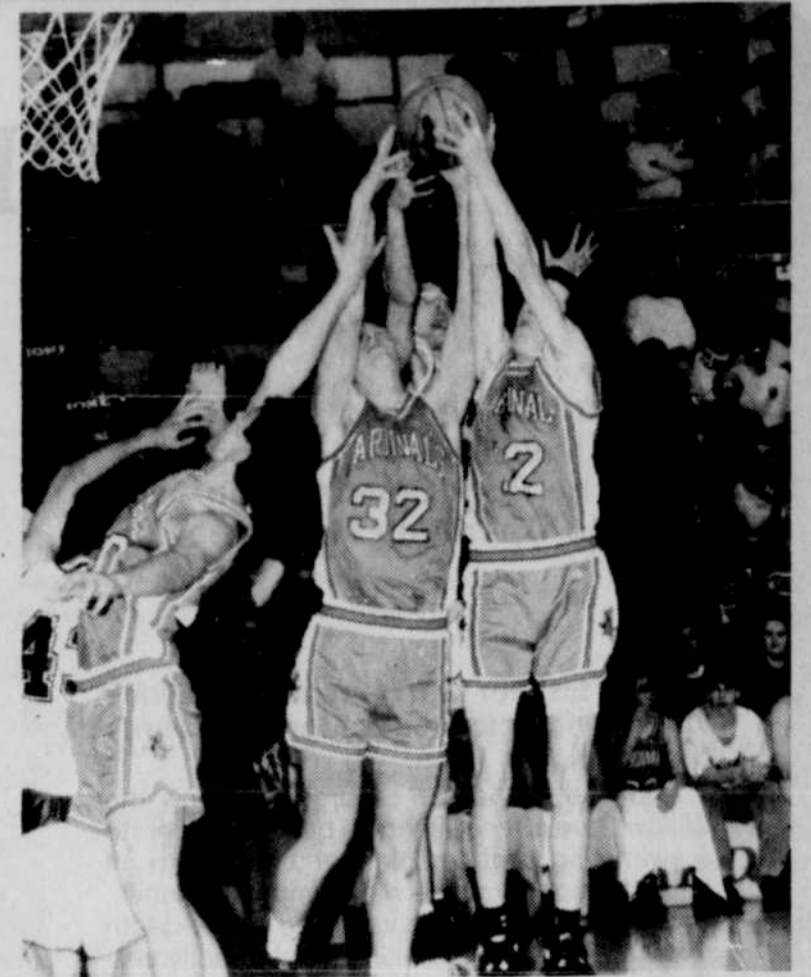

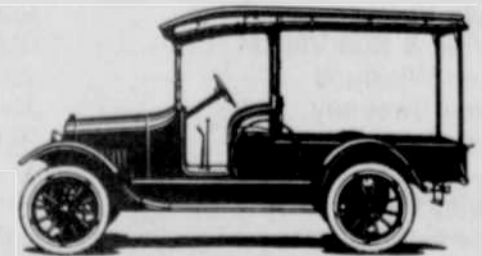
