Donated items include a float tube, typewriter, Pendleton blanket, cedar dog beds, picture frames and artwork, new

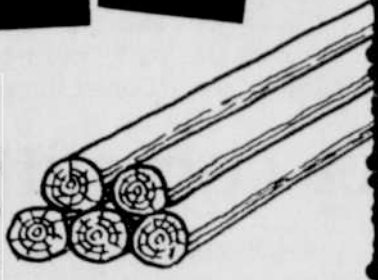
