Tree pruning workshop March 23

Healthy trees contribute greatly to the quality of life in eastern Oregon. If trees are taken for granted, they may receive too little care or be damaged by inappropriate practices.

A basic tree pruning workshop for homeowners will be conducted in Heppner on

Thurs., March 23. The workshop will be conducted by the Oregon Department of Forestry, in cooperation with the Morrow County Extension Service. The clinic will be held at the Morrow County Extension office located in the Pettyjohn building beginning at 4 p.m.

The Oregon Department of Forestry will begin both programs with an audio-visual presentation, then take participants to city property for a "hands-on" pruning experience. Participants should be prepared with appropriate outdoor clothing.

There is no cost to attend this educational program. Participants will learn: proper tree care; the dangers of topping trees; how to have the best looking trees in the neighborhood; and correct pruning techniques.
