#### Estrogen-Replacement May Aid Memory

Menopause is a medical term that refers to the ending of ovulation and monthly menstrual periods in women. While this event occurs most often between the ages of 40 and 50, it can happen as late as age 60. According to *Family Medical Guide* published by the American Medical Association, about 25 percent of women reach menopause without any symptoms, except cessation of menstrual periods. About 50 percent experience mild mental and physical changes. The remaining 25 percent experience more significant physical symptoms such as hot flashes, sweating, headaches, joint pain, and vaginal dryness. Mental changes include sleep disturbances, depression, anxiety, irritability, difficulty concentrating, and memory loss.

Estrogen replacement corrects many symptoms experienced during and after menopause. Studies indicate that estrogen provides other benefits such as reducing the risk of osteoporosis and heart attacks. According to an article in the medical journal *Obstetrics and Gynecology*, another possible benefit of estrogen has been discovered. In a study of 71 healthy women who had recently experienced menopause, those receiving estrogen replacement had significantly higher scores on tests for verbal memory skills than women who did not receive estrogen.
