The city of Heppner and the county of Morrow are each constructing toilets for the accommodation of travelers and the public in general. The city is building one just at the rear of the jail building on their lot on Willow Street, and the county will put in a toilet near the fair grounds. The urgent necessity of these accommodations has at last impressed itself upon our authorities and we are glad to note that the actual work is being done. And in 1995 with a little different wording "City Park to see new restrooms". This was a joint effort with the Chamber applying for the Kinzua grant and the city providing the match and legwork. (We trust that the design as compared to those 1918 structures will reflect progress.)

Such positive happenings in Heppner, a far cry from a year ago when we felt we were heading for rock bottom. Our current surge of community energy and positive attitude meant passage of the pool, school and county measures; progress is being made on our ag history museum, the RV park is up and running and we continue to look at diversified ideas to keep Heppner healthy. It's a great community. On the downside, merchants are having some shoplifting problems and we sometimes have vandalism. Hopefully, we can reach those involved with other challenges to enable them to learn to feel good about accomplishment, community pride and honesty; rather than seeking dishonesty for whatever reason. Your chamber is open for suggestions from all ages.

Chamber will be planning some educational tours and meetings to gain input on your ideas for the Main Street revitalization project. Remember those trees some of you purchased in 1991? They will actually be visible in late 1997.

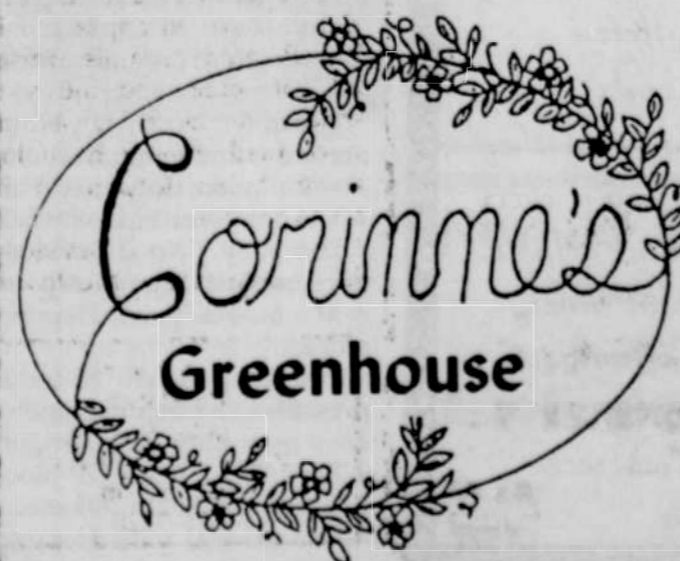
