The auction will begin at 10:30 and features antiques, home baked food items, handmade items, and much more. Triad will be the auctioneers. The silent auction will start at 10:15 a.m., with bids opened at 12:30 p.m. The barbecue beef dinner begins at 12:30 p.m. Prices are \$5 for adults, \$2.50 for children 6-12, and preschool free.

Forest Service waives fees for Tupper outdoor school

The Forest Service and Morrow County School District have recently signed a cooperative agreement that will only require the school district to pay actual utilities and damage repair costs. The School District began using Tupper Work Center for their sixth grade Outdoor School Program in 1978. The Forest Service has charged them an annual fee which has ranged between \$258 and \$960. The fee covered the maintenance costs of preparing Tupper for use, as well as the cost of utilities.

The main purpose of the fee reduction is the Forest Service's support of the Outdoor School and the realization of the school

district's declining budget. "We understand that the school district is facing serious budget cuts and without our help, Outdoor School may no longer be a possibility," commented Heppner District Ranger Delanne Ferguson. "We think this is a great program for the students and are hoping it will continue."

Although the decision to waive a portion of the fee was made only recently, the Forest Service has not billed the school district for the past three years due to sufficient funds on account from previous years' billings. The school district will not be billed again this year, or as long as funds on account are available.

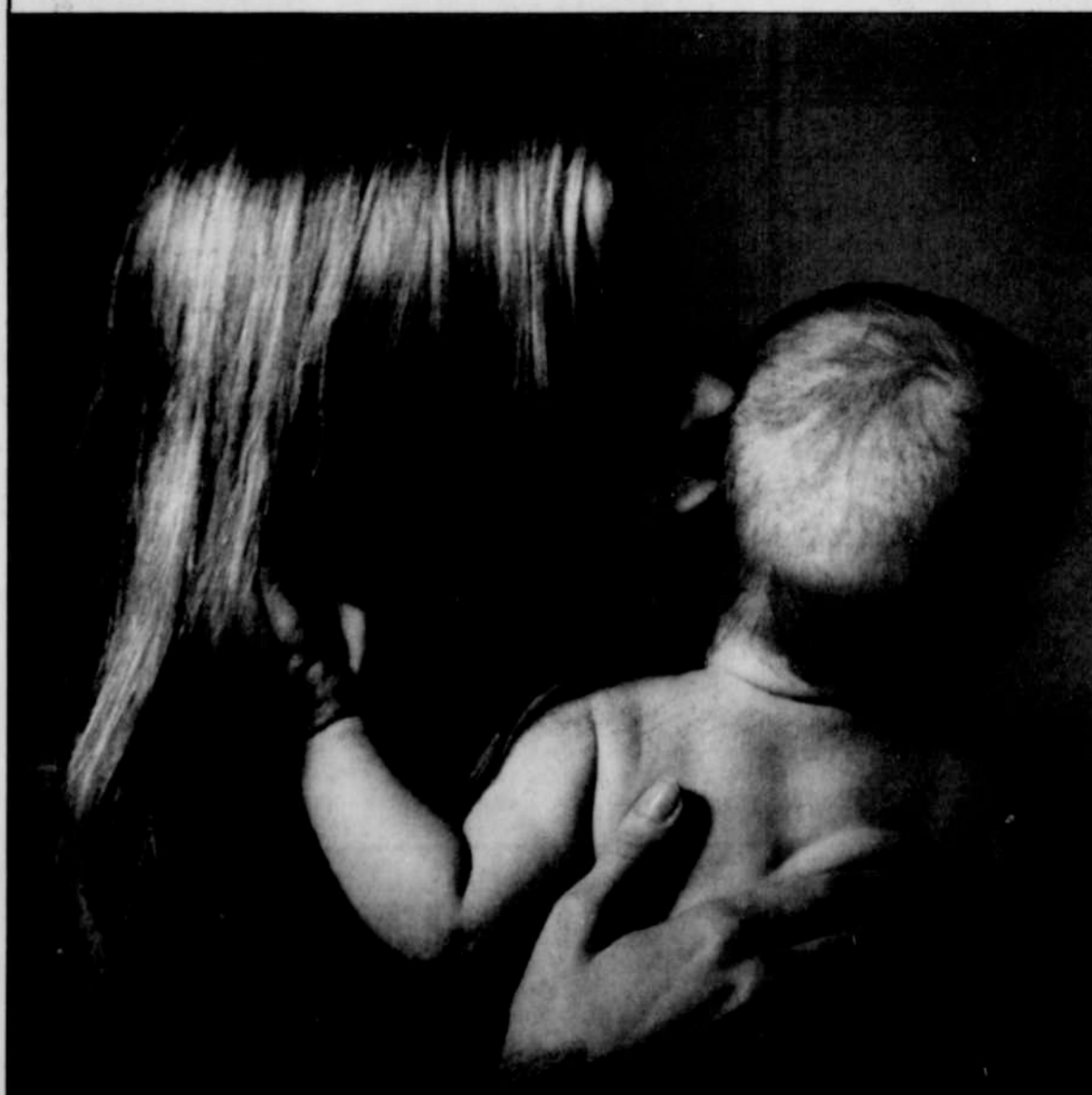
