Mrs. Boyle was born to Kinnie and Geraldine Wilson Haddock on May 20, 1933 at Anderson, Missouri. The family moved to Pueblo, Colorado while she was still a young child. She attended school there and graduated from Central High School in 1951. After completing two years of junior college in Pueblo she went to Western State College in Gunnison, Colorado, where she majored in education. She graduated in 1955 with a B.A. degree.

On August 5, 1955, she married Frederick H. Boyle. In the early years of their marriage they lived in South Dakota, Massachusetts, Alaska, Florida and North Carolina. She taught first through third grades during these years and spent time as a homemaker raising her young family. The family moved to Bend in 1967 when he accepted the position as president of Central Oregon Community College.

She was an active member of many women's groups including AAUW and PEO. She taught in the Bend School District as a substitute for several years and had a life long devotion to the education of young children. She was an avid reader and enjoyed many different hobbies.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by two daughters Kathleen Lowe of Heppner and Megan Boyle of LaGrande; a son Keenan (Tim) Boyle of Portland; her mother Geraldine Haddock of Bend; and three grandchildren Travis, Trenton and Caitlin of Heppner. She was preceded in death by a son Kevin in 1967 and her father in 1984.
