About 80 members and guests gathered at the St. Patrick's Parish Hall, where a luncheon was prepared by the St. Patrick's Altar Society.

Elaine Belts, Pendleton, district chairperson, presided over the meeting. Plans were finalized for the Oregon State Federation of Garden Clubs' (OSFGC) state convention, to be held in Pendleton June 26-28, at the Red Lion Inn.

As a garden club member, "There's something for everyone," said speaker Marian Allen, Portland, current president of the OSFGC. According to the association's pledge, members strive to protect and conserve natural resources and to promote education for the betterment of the environment, as well as wildlife.

The club does more than improve communities, and help others to attain skills ranging from container plantings to flower arrangements, Allen said. There are many things a person can do while they are young, but the friendships that develop through this association will always be there, she said.

However, Allen's participation has extended beyond the social aspect since she became a member in 1974. Now at the helm of the state association comprising of 143 clubs, Allen has helped the association grow to include some 4,000 members statewide during her six year commitment to state association offices.

Allen is also recognized as a master flower show judge and a master gardener. She plans to take courses to become a qualified landscape artist, and assist in developing landscaping plans around commercial or civic buildings. That expertise can also be used in park developments as well as other community and state projects, such as the Willamette National Cemetery.

As reported at this district meeting, the various clubs take on projects to enhance communities by planting trees and providing planter arrangements in city areas. Providing bouquets to newcomers and shut-ins is also a way of sharing with others, along with decorating tables for community functions. Proceeds from plant sales and other fundraisers are often used for community improvement projects as well as scholarships for students.

"We enjoy friendship and fellowship while working together on projects," said Heppner Garden Club president, Jane Rawlins. Heppner club meetings are held on the first Monday evening of the month, at the St. Patrick's Senior Center. Guests are always welcome and membership is open to all who care about various gardening and decorating aims to enhance our lives, Rawlins said.
