The five elderly women staying at Hill House in Heppner can now work the soil in raised bed gardens, thanks to operator Nella Britt.

Raised garden beds are recommended for individuals that find the bending involved with conventional gardening either difficult or impossible. While the women that stay at Hill House are not confined to wheelchairs, they do suffer from a variety of ailments that range from heart problems to

diabetes to poor eyesight. With the aid of one of the residents, Britt recently planted the gardens with a variety of flowers and vegetables.

Summer chemistry classes offered

The Hands on Science "Chemistry" classes will be offered this summer at the Heppner Elementary School for children who will be entering grades K-6 this fall.

The K-1 class "Chemistry Detectives" will have students experimenting with mixtures, solutions, and acids and bases. Soap balls, bath salts, ink and glue are some of the things the students will concoct. The children will also become science sleuths to solve the "Gold Paper Caper".

In the second and third grade class "Kitchen Chemistry" students will learn how to safely mix and measure to enjoy the magic of changing colors, liberating gases, and analyzing solutions. All of this will be done with things found in the kitchen.

"Your Own Mini-Lab" is the fourth-sixth grade class. Students will make their own mini-chemistry lab. They will make cheese, glue, play putty, and more with the equipment.

There will be eight classes total in the session. The classes will meet Monday through

Thursday for two weeks beginning July 19. The class meeting times are K-one from 8-9 a.m.; second-third from 9:30-10:30 a.m.; and fourth-sixth from 11 a.m. to noon. The registration fee is \$45, which covers the cost of materials, teacher salaries, liability insurance, and administrative costs. All materials will be sent home with the students in hopes that the experiments and activities will be repeated, said Sarah Carlson, program coordinator.

"This chemistry series is only available once every three years, truly making it a unique opportunity for children to participate in recreational science. After seeing the materials and lessons for this series, I can confidently say that any child taking these classes will have fun while learning chemistry science," said Carlson.

Registration will close June 16. Registration forms are available through the Heppner and Lone Schools, or may be obtained from Carlson. A limited number of scholarships are available. For more information, contact Carlson, 422-7245.
