## Grace Sandlin awarded scholarship

Grace Sandlin, a member of Morrow County Oregon School Employees' Association (OSEA) Chapter #59, will be awarded a \$1,000 scholarship at the 57th annual OSEA conference held June 24, at Wilsonville.

The scholarship, funded by a 15 cent monthly dues assessment of all 12,500 members, is for continuing education. Sandlin has until the fall of 1998 to use the funds.

Sandlin, a custodian and teacher's aide for Morrow County School District, has been a member of OSEA since July 1987, and has worked for the school district since 1986. She, her husband, and two

children moved to Irrigon in 1984.

She has completed one year of studies at Blue Mountain Community College, some in-district credit classes, and a home-study course in maintenance supervision.

"An education in computer and secretarial science would improve my chances of moving to a more challenging area within the school system," Sandlin stated on her scholarship application. She was honored at the Morrow County Chapter meeting May 15, with a presentation by Theresa Bosworth, OSEA State Board Zone VII director, Blue Mountain Community College Chapter #150.

## Women's lives in WWII at museum

Jacqueline Dirks, assistant professor of history at Reed College, will present "Women's Lives on the Homefront" at the Morrow County Museum on Thursday, June 22, at 7 p.m.

The program will provide a panoramic look at American women during the war in a variety of settings: in the war industries, in the military, on farms and at home, and for

Japanese-American women, in the internment camps. Dirks will explore how the war affected different regions of the country and permanently altered roles of women in American society.

Dirks' appearance is the fifth in a series of programs being held in conjunction with "Produce for Victory: Posters on the American Home Front 1941-45", a Smithsonian exhibit, and "Fighters on the Farm Front", an OSU exhibit.

Both exhibits are on display at the Morrow County Museum through July 12. The Morrow County Museum is open 1-5 p.m., Saturday through Wednesday. Admission to the museum and to this series of speakers is free.

"Women's Lives on the Homefront" is presented in part by a grant from The Oregon Council for the Humanities, an affiliate of the National Endowment for Humanities.
