

Students earn R & W certificates

The R & W Reading Program, sponsored by Tom and Helen Riehl of the R & W Drive-In of Heppner, recently concluded its ninth year at Heppner Elementary and Middle School.

The Riehls originally established this program as a way to encourage the development of a life-long reading habit. Students are rewarded with treats at the R & W Drive-In when they reach goals in reading established by their reading teachers. Goals are determined on an individual basis and vary according to the age and reading ability of the child. Students are challenged to read on a regular basis from a variety of levels of difficulty, authors and genres.
