### Scholarship deadline nears

The Gertrude McRae Scholarship Committee announces that applications for scholarships are still available. Students graduating from Grant County high schools will be given preference. Graduates of Wheeler, Morrow and Wasco counties, in that order, will also be considered. Preference for grants will be

given to those having completed one or more years of college and preference will be to Oregon residents. Applications are due by August 1, at 5 p.m., and may be obtained at the Grant County Courthouse by contacting County Judge Dennis Reynolds, P.O. ### Morrow County's forest receipts down

An estimated \$142 million dollars will be shared by 31 counties in Oregon and 27 counties in Washington as their portion of the 1995 National Forest System receipts. This amount is about 53% of the \$268 million in receipts distributed nationally among 43 states and Puerto Rico. According to Regional Forester John Lowe of the Pacific Northwest Region, the Oregon estimated total is \$109,857,778.39, with Morrow County's estimated total for 1995 set at \$95,484. (Last year, Morrow County received \$256,092.) The estimated share for Washington is \$31,782,016.43. "We provide these advance estimates of payments to help local budget planners," Lowe said, adding that "final payments will be based on actual amounts collected."

Provisions of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 were designed to mitigate economic effects associated with the listing of the northern spotted owl. This year, they allow the Forest Service to pay counties affected by reductions in forest revenues at a rate equal to 82 percent of a five-year (1986-1990) average. Normally, 25 percent of revenues collected from land-use fees and the sale of resources from 24.5 million acres of national forests and national grasslands go to the states, which are required by federal law to use their share of the money for public schools and roads. Interim payments representing 75 percent of the estimated total state shares of national forest receipts will be made in October. The balance will be paid in December, when final figures on the revenue collected during fiscal year 1995 are available.

### Volleyball game at David Douglas

The location of the state All Star Volleyball game on July 15 at 6 p.m., for 3A, 2A and 1A schools, has been changed to David Douglas High School in northeast Portland. Lone volleyball coach, Charity McElligott will be coach for the game and lone player Mary Jane McCarty will be one of only two 1A girls playing in the state.

### Asthma Drug Recommended for Approval

Asthma is an obstruction and inflammation of the airway passages from the mouth to the lungs. This chronic health problem affects approximately 12 million Americans. Researchers are constantly evaluating new medicines which may help the millions of children and adults who suffer from asthma.

Recently an advisory committee of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recommended approval of a new type of asthma medicine. The new drug, called *zileuton*, has both anti-inflammatory and bronchodilator activity. A unique property of *zileuton* is that it inhibits the action of enzymes referred to as leukotrienes. These enzymes are thought to cause inflammation of the air passages. Asthmatics tend to have high levels of leukotrienes present in nasal secretions and in fluid lining the lungs. Blocking the effect of leukotrienes is thought to improve forced expiratory flow rates, and in some patients there may be a reduced need for other asthma medicines (beta agonists and corticosteroids).

*Zileuton* can cause headache, abdominal pain, dizziness, and insomnia. Even though the potential for liver problems is low, the manufacturer recommends liver function tests be conducted at the beginning of therapy, at three months, and then periodically.
