**Sunglasses Can Protect Against UV Light**

The ultraviolet (UV) rays of the sun can damage the eyes. UV light can cause cataracts (clouding of the eye lens) and damage to the retina (back of the eye where observed images are projected). According to the *Handbook of Nonprescription Drugs*, UV light can cause temporary damage called photokeratitis, a painful type of "snow blindness" that affects the cornea.

Many individuals mistakenly think that all sunglasses equally protect the eyes. All sunglasses are not the same. According to Dr. William Blockstein, writing in a recent issue of *Pharmacy Today*, there are several things to consider when selecting UV protective sunglasses:

1. Look for "Z-80.3" printed on the frames. Lenses should block 75 to 90 percent of visible light. When you look in the mirror while wearing glasses, it should be difficult to see your eyes.
2. The lenses of sunglasses should be large enough to block light from around the edge of the glasses.
3. Glasses should fit properly. When glasses slip down a person's nose as little as quarter of an inch, 20% more UV light reaches the eyes.
