Founded more than 12 years ago through the determination and compassion of one woman, Sr. Maria Francis, the ministry manages funds for housing, food, medical and mental health referrals and offers a "friendly safe haven off the streets," says a press release.

The lone group will walk in memory of their friend, Jason Halvorsen, who was killed in a car accident in April 1994. Halvorsen was one of the students who had planned to participate in the race last year, and after his death, the lone community rallied to collect donations in his memory.
