Log bucking contest, Aug. 20



Log Bucking contest is hard work

Everyone is invited to the fairgrounds, Sunday, August 20, to watch the annual amateur log bucking and wrapper throwing contest. The contest begins at 10:30 a.m.

Cash prizes will be awarded in the Morrow County log bucking and wrapper throwing contests up to fourth place.

The open classes contest has no cubic limit and pays a \$100 jackpot plus entry fee. There is a \$10 entry fee per class.

Contestants may use only stock saws. No modified chainsaws are allowed in the Morrow County class.

In the wrapper throwing contest, a timed event, contestants

will throw binders over the logs on a log truck and will bind the load. The truck, binders and logs will be furnished. The wrapper throwing contest will follow the log bucking contest.

Darlene Scroggins and Penland House Bed and Breakfast will furnish the Larry Scroggins Memorial Buckle for first place in the wrapper throwing contest.

All log truck drivers are invited to sign up for the throwing contest. Signups must be completed by 10 a.m. Sunday.
