

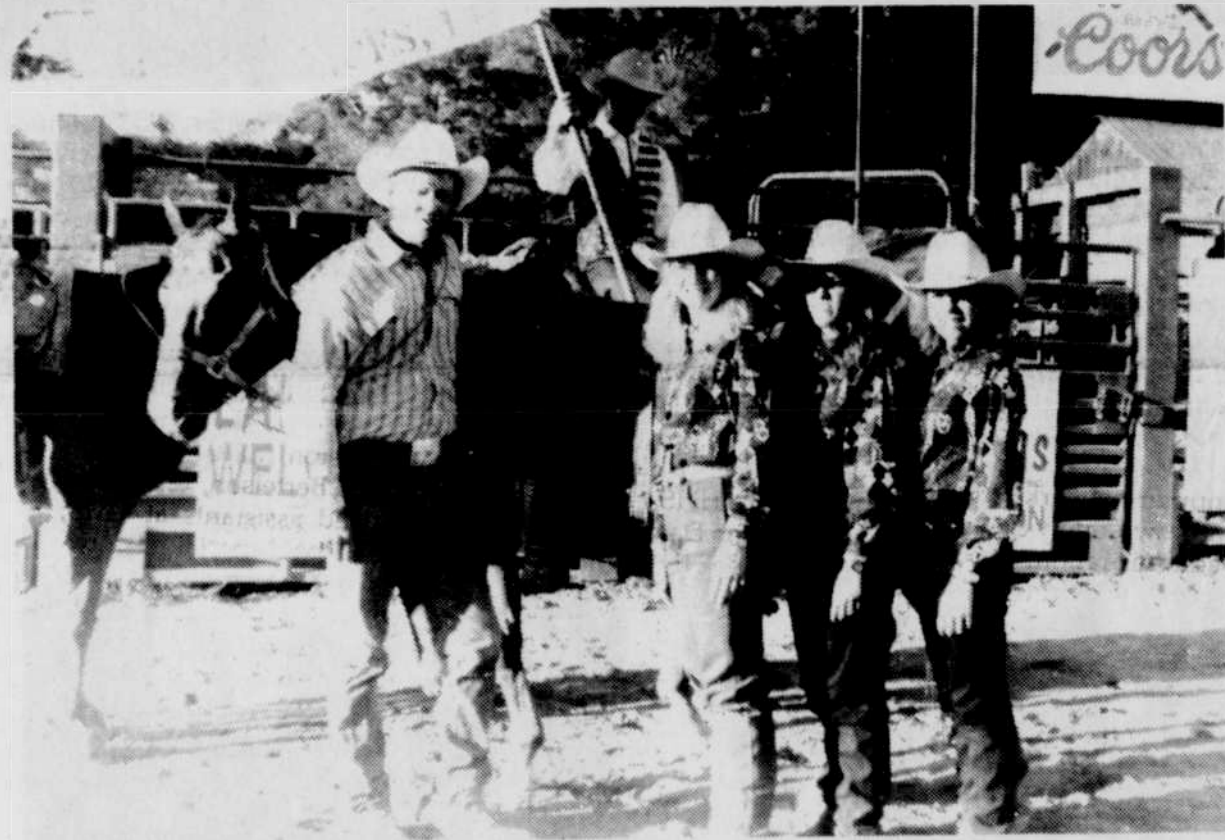

## School computer network funded

The Morrow County School Board, at their regular meeting Aug. 14 at A.C. Houghton Elementary School in Irrigon, approved a proposal from OPTEC, a Portland technology firm.

The board approved a proposal from OPTEC for \$15,800 for consulting and design for phase I in a plan to implement a computer network for 125 to 150 Morrow County classrooms and administration.

Phase II, which will also be completed by OPTEC, will involve implementation of design, wiring and set up. Phase II will use state bidding system and will employ various vendors.

-learned that the Morrow County School District food service program has reduced its budgetary needs to \$26,000, which is within a thousand dollars of its target a year early. The district had planned to reduce the food service budget to \$25,00 by next year. The district had spent over \$300,000 several years earlier for the program, before Ballot Measure 5 and reductions in state school funding necessitated cuts.
