Hearing screening to be conducted

The Umatilla-Morrow Education Service District (ESD) will provide hearing screening to public elementary school students including all kindergarten, first and third grade students, new students to the county and parent/teacher/principal referrals of students in the other grades. Ione and Heppner students will be screened on Wednesday, Nov. 1. Re-checks will be Monday, Nov. 13.

Obituary

George Guy Morgan

George Guy Morgan, 70, Coos Bay, formerly of Heppner, died August 29, 1995, at Coos Bay.

Funeral services were held Sept. 1 at the Coos Bay Chapel. Mr. Morgan was born August 21, 1925, at Grand Junction, Colorado. He was a World War II Army veteran and was one of nine survivors of the 80 HQ 75 infantry after the Battle of the Bulge. He served in France at St. Lo and the Ruhr Valley Pocket. He was awarded two overseas service bars, the European African Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with three bronze battle stars, a good conduct medal and the WWII Victory medal bronze star.

Mr. Morgan married Irene Ingalls Dec. 1, 1946, at Toledo. In 1949, as a Heppner city waste employee, he was elected the city manager, the city water marshal and the chief of police for one year. He later worked in Heppner as a powder monkey and helped blow out the hill where the hospital is located.

For the past 40 years, the Morgans have resided in the Coos Bay area. Mr. Morgan was employed as a millwright at Weyerhaeuser's main mill for 30 years until he retired in 1985. He was a past president and active member of the Coos Bay Eagles Lodge Aerie no. 538. He was a former member of the Elks and Moose lodges. He enjoyed working and hunting.

Survivors include his wife, Irene, Coos Bay; four daughters and sons-in-law, Marcella and John DeVoe, Allegany, Mickie and Christopher Ebert and Faith and George Eisele, all Coos Bay, and Melinda Little, Wenatchee, WA; one son and daughter-in-law, Michael and Carla Morgan, Hermiston; 16 grandchildren and 20 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Guy and Stella Cooper Morgan and a brother, James G. Morgan.

Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance Section 3.020 and OAR 660-06-025(4)(o) and (5).

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposal or to ask questions will be provided. Failure to raise specific issues at this hearing precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues.
