Senior halfback Shaun Hisler carried the ball 10 times on the drive and scored from two yards out to make the score 20-12. Hisler gained 106 yards on 27 carries, his third 100 yard effort in four weeks. Quarterback Brian Koffler found tight end Damien Wilhelm in the end zone for the pat to make the final score 22-12. Wilhelm also caught a 36 yard third down pass from Koffler for the big play of the drive.

Heppner scored first on this warm autumn evening with halfback Rod Zumwalt zipping around left end from 29 yards out for the Mustangs' first score. The pat was wide right and Heppner led 6-0.


