Solar interference may affect cable

Heppner T.V. Inc. service may be interrupted from Oct. 5-15 between 3:45-4:02 p.m. daily because of solar interference. Other satellites will be off for this reason about 35 minutes later.

"Solar interference is an inherent part of satellite operations and occurs in the spring

and fall of each year," said Heppner T.V. manager Judie Laughlin. "This takes place when the orbital positions of the satellite and the sun are in one line. The earth station then receives signals from both, but the more powerful sun subdues the desired signal, causing a loss of service."
