A memorial service for Don Gunderson, Sr. was held September 30, in Willamette Christian Church in West Linn, with a private interment in Willamette National Cemetery.
Mr. Gunderson died September 27, 1995 of cancer at the age of 66.

DA's Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's office in Heppner reports handling the following business during the past week:

Sept. 26: Lydia Pena, 34, Boardman, was convicted of two counts of delivery of a controlled substance (methamphetamine) within 1,000 feet of a school. The conviction stems from two incidents occurring in January and March when Pena was arrested for selling methamphetamine from her apartment across from Riverside High School in Boardman. She will be sentenced Oct. 26.
Martin Prado, 24, Hermiston, formerly convicted of burglary in 1993 in Morrow County, was convicted of violating parole. He was ordered into a drug treatment facility pending sentence on Nov. 30.

Mariano Cavillo-Ramirez, 16, Boardman, was indicted by a Morrow County Grand Jury for Rape I and Sexual Abuse I. Cavillo-Ramirez is accused of victimizing an 11 year old Boardman girl. He is the first ballot number 11 case in Morrow County and is being treated as an adult in spite of his age. He is scheduled to appear Oct. 5.
