OSEA to meet with county school board

The Oregon School Employees Association (OSEA), Morrow County Classified Chapter 59 will meet with the Morrow County School Board on Monday, Jan. 8, for a hearing on OSEA Chapter 59's grievance relating to the contracting out of the Morrow County School District bus drivers.

OSEA charges that the Morrow County School Board violated the current collective bargaining agreement by contracting out student transportation without gaining a mutual agreement with OSEA to do so.

"The school board never bargained in good faith with the dedicated and long-term district bus drivers. The school board chose, instead, to take

OSEA, in reviewing the legal and contractual challenges filed against the Morrow County School Board, decided on Dec. 18 to withdraw its petition for an injunction to stop the district from implementing the contracting out. OSEA says it will focus its legal challenges on the two Unfair Labor Practices filed with the State of Oregon's Employment Relations Board and the filed contractual grievance.

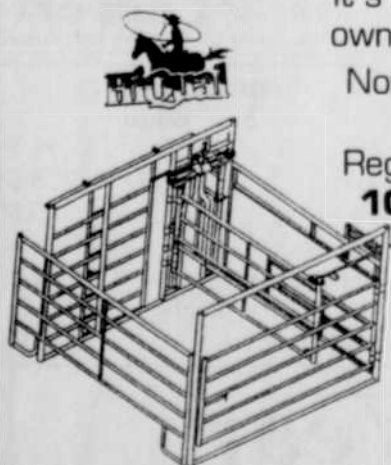
