Roger Butterfield, artist in education, recently completed a two week residency at the Lone Schools. He taught lessons in the art of carving to students in kindergarten through sixth grade and the junior/senior high art classes. Butterfield used mostly edible materials such as fruits and vegetables in teaching elementary students to carve. Rod Taylor donated potatoes from his farm to be used in some of the carvings. Older students worked with more difficult materials such as soap and wax. An open house display of student work was well attended by parents and community members on the last day of the

workshop. "The Artist in Education Program is unique in that it offers students an opportunity to broaden their knowledge of art and enhance skills by working with professional artists," said teacher Betty Rietmann. "Teachers and students agreed that the program this year was educational and also fun." Butterfield was taught the folk art of pocketknife whittling at the age of seven by his grandfather. He continued his art education at Southern Oregon State College, majoring in design and sculpture. He presently produces wood sculptures on commission for homes and businesses in the West.

Nedeau E. Chase

Nedeau E. Chase, 79, of Fossil, died Saturday, January 6, 1996, at Oregon Health Sciences University in Portland. The funeral was Wednesday, January 10, 1996 at the United Methodist Church in Fossil. Concluding service and burial followed at the Condon Masonic Cemetery.

Mrs. Chase was born February 20, 1916, at the family home in Ferry Canyon near Condon, to Lewis and Janet Geddes Couture. She grew up in the Condon area and attended area schools, graduating from Condon High School in 1934.

After attending business college in Portland, she returned to Condon where she was employed as Gilliam County Deputy Clerk.

In 1938, she married Pete Fisk at Goldendale, Washington. They lived at Prineville and in Glendale, Arizona, before returning to Condon. Mr. Fisk died returning from active duty after World War II.

She married Donald E. Chase on November 8, 1946, at Portland. They moved to Fossil where they owned and operated Value Variety store. Mr. Chase died in 1989.

Mrs. Chase was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary and the Fossil United Methodist Church.

DA's Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's office in Heppner reports handling the following business during the past week:

Jan. 2: Steven Mark Brockett, Irrigon, was convicted of Assault IV, stemming from an incident that occurred in November 1995. Brockett allegedly assaulted his wife at their residence. He was sentenced to serve 10 days in the county jail, undergo anger management counseling, commit no acts of violence against his wife and no further violation of the law.

On Dec. 23, Richard Gary Doser, 27, and Curtis Marvin Grigsby, 31, both Portland area, were arrested near Arlington on charges of Kidnap, Robbery and Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. It was alleged that Doser and Grigsby ordered a pizza from Pizza Hut in Kennewick, and when the pizza delivery person arrived, abducted him at gunpoint, forced him into the delivery car and made him drive to Boardman. THE MORROW COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION will hold the following hearings of public interest on Monday, January 29, 1996, at 7:30 p.m. at the North Morrow Annex Building in Irrigon:

Land Partitioning Application No. LP-S-168: Billy J. and Marilyn A. Rietmann, applicants and owners. Property is described as Tax Lot 4100 of Assessor's Map 1N 24 30, lo-

cated on the west side of Stefani Road, four and a half miles north of the City of Lone. The proposal is to partition a 186.19 acre parcel out of a 720.32 acre parcel in an Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) Zone. Criteria for approval include Subdivision Ordinance 5.020 and 5.030.

Conditional Use Permit Application No. N-82: Don and Lela Key, applicants and owners. Property is described as Tax Lot 101 of Assessor's Map 3N 27 4, located approximately three miles south of the Umatilla Army Depot and I-84 on Turner Road. The proposal is to partition a 1.01 acre parcel with a mobile home located on it out of a 308.86 acre parcel in an Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) Zone. Technically, the request is for a Variance to the minimum lot size of 160 acres and a land partition. Criteria for approval include Subdivision Ordinance Sections 5.020, 5.030 and Zoning Ordinance Sections 3.010 and 6.050, and Oregon Administrative Rules.

Land Partitioning Application No. LP-N-169: Floyd and Lorraine Wilson, applicants and owners. Property is described as Tax Lot 202 of Assessor's Map 5N 26 36, located on the north side of Slaughter Road, approximately 3 miles southwest of the City of Irrigon. Application is to partition a 15.01 acre parcel of land into three parcels. Each parcel meets the one acre minimum lot size of the Rural Residential One Acre Zone. Criteria for approval include Subdivision Ordinance 5.020 and 5.030.

Conditional Use Permit Application No. S-83: Ron Carlson, applicant; Ron and Kim Carlson, owners. Property is described as Tax Lot 901 of Assessor's Map 4S 28 11, located approximately 15 miles southeast of Heppner in the Blake Ranch area off North Fork of Willow Creek Road. The proposal is to site a dwelling on a five acre parcel of land in a Forest Use Zone. Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance 3.020 and 6.050 and Oregon Administrative Rules.

HEPPNER RANGER DISTRICT PROPOSES TWO TIMBER SALES--LONE STAR AND HOLLYWOOD
The Heppner Ranger District of the Umatilla National Forest is in the process of conducting an Environmental Analysis for two salvage sales located in Morrow County:

Lone Star--proposes to salvage approximately 6.0 MMBf of wood products from 1,823 acres. Some live, small diameter trees would be commercially thinned to reduce overstocking and improve stand health. Several stands proposed for treatment lie within dedicated old growth areas that field reviews indicate no longer meet criteria for functioning old growth habitat. The objective of salvage would be to trade treated areas for more suitable stands or treat the proposed stands such that old growth character could be developed as soon as possible. Some stands within the periphery of the Texas Butte Roadless Area have also been proposed for treatment. Some of these stands may require construction of temporary roads which would later be closed and obliterated.

Hollywood--proposes to salvage approximately 1.3 MMBf of wood products from 200 acres. Commercial thinning is proposed for 40 acres to enhance growth and improve vigor. This entire project would occur within the Texas Butte Roadless Area; however, harvest would occur from existing roadbeds.

Land Partitioning Application No. LP-N-170: Arnold and Mary Lou Braat, applicants and owners. Property is described as Tax Lot 100 of Assessor's Map 4N 26 20B, located on the south side of Kunze Road, approximately one mile southwest of the City of Boardman. Property is within the Urban Growth area of the City of Boardman. Application is to partition a 37.43 acre parcel into two parcels. Each parcel meets the one acre minimum lot size of the Suburban Residential One Acre Zone. Criteria for approval include Subdivision Ordinance 5.020 and 5.030.

Application for a Zoning Amendment: Rob Brown and Sharon Timms, Applicants. Amendment to Zoning Ordinance affects the Suburban Residential One Acre Zone outside the Urban Growth Boundary of the City of Irrigon. This area is north from Highway 730 to Columbia River, and west from Irrigon City Limits to Fourth Street West. The amendment to the Ordinance is for requirements affecting manufactured homes on individual lots. Criteria for approval include Zoning Ordinance Article 8.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposal or to ask questions will be provided. Failure to raise specific issues at this hearing precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues.
