

Fillies beat Wahtonka Eagles

The Heppner Fillies added another win to their CBC record; they are now 4-2. The Fillies played great team ball and aggressive defensive to capture a 50-44 win over the Wahtonka Eagles, Friday, Jan. 26, at home.

With Stormy Howard out of the lineup with an elbow injury, coach John Boyer called upon Jill Barber to step up and start the game as point guard and Barber played up to the challenge. Lexi Matteson came alive with seven rebounds, four points and four assists.

Lori Moeller led the Fillies with a game-high 17 points, eight rebounds and three assists. Annie Hisler played an outstanding game, adding seven points to the board and helping to keep the Fillies in a controlled game. The Fillies had a season-low nine turnovers, but had trouble from the free throw line, hitting only 15-31 attempts.

With senior Jossie Evans in foul trouble, Mindy Binschus saw more playing time and added six points to the scoring effort. Tina Kemp scored five points, Lindsey Waterland, Barber and Matteson added four points each and Evans finished out the scoring with three points.

Students compete in Knowledge Master

The winter version of the Elementary Knowledge Master Open was held at Heppner Elementary School (HES) Friday, Jan. 26, for fifth and sixth grade students. Linda Shaw, HES Talented and Gifted coordinator, held separate sessions for students selected to participate in each grade. Students were selected based on past demonstrations of academic achievement and problem solving ability, including qualification for the district math and spelling contests and the local Geography Bee.

The sixth grade students who participated in the activity set a new school record for the elementary contest. For sixth grade teams, their score of 623 was fifth in Oregon and 237 of 541 teams worldwide. The students who participated were Jesse Gutierrez, Jody Maddern, Julie Proctor, Shelley Rietmann, Olivia Sagely and Molly Turrell.

A group of fifth graders was introduced to this activity. Brad Adams, Sally Calvert, Daniel Jepsen, Jeremy Lawson, Marcy Miller and Doug Orwick scored 512 on the same set of questions.

The Knowledge Master tests students' knowledge and their ability to apply it. Areas covered include American and world history, government, geography, recent events, literature, English, math, physical and earth science, biology, health, art and music.
