The HHS squad took third place in the 1A-2A division out of 75 schools competing in the Oregon State Athletic Association Cheerleading Championships held Saturday, Feb. 3, at the Memorial Coliseum in Portland. ### BMCC to offer computer classes

The Morrow County Center of Blue Mountain Community College (BMCC) announces that two Macintosh Computer classes are being offered in the area by local instructor, Sarah Carlson.

Welcome to the Mac is scheduled for Thursday evening, Feb. 8, from 5-9 p.m., and Friday, Feb. 9, from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. at Ione Elementary School.

"Whether you have been using the Mac for some time or if you are just starting out, this class will show you the ins and outs of the Macintosh and its operating system," said Anne Morter, BMCC Morrow County coordinator. The course covers terminology, peripherals and some of the common applications that make the Mac "such a joy to use".

This is a beginner level class and students are welcome to bring their own machines. Cost is \$45 for the two day course. The senior citizen discount

does not apply to this class.

Multimedia and the Mac is scheduled for Thursday, Feb. 15, from 5-9 p.m., and Friday, Feb. 16, from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. at Heppner Elementary School.

This class will have the students using such applications as Hypercard and Digital Chisel to create multimedia presentations. Students will learn about scanners, CD ROMs, laser discs, photo CDs, sound files and how to use them to create multimedia files for presentations. Some knowledge of the Macintosh computer and its operating system is recommended as entry skills for this class. The class is considered an intermediate level course.

Tuition is \$45 for the 10 hour class. The senior citizen discount does not apply to this class.
