



It came right down to the last few minutes in a close-scoring contest before the Ione fans could breathe a sigh of relief Friday, Feb. 9. The home team pulled out the win, 54-50, over the Echo Cougars.

Melissa McElligott had a great night, scoring a gamehigh 32 points by hitting 10 field goals and making 11 of 13 free throws. Suzy Heideman contributed 17, with seven field goals and three for three from the foul line.

Ione outscored Echo 14-9 in the first quarter and 16-7 in the third. Echo shot a higher percentage than the Cardinals from the field, making 40 percent of their shots, compared to Ione's 38.8 percent. However, the Lady Cards shot 87.5 percent to the Cougars 69.2 per-
