Mrs. Peterson was born November 19, 1904, in Ione, the youngest of 10 children. Her parents, Paul and Margaret Rietmann, were one of the pioneer families of Morrow County, homesteading in Ione in the 1880s. She married Victor G. Peterson on September 8, 1927, in Pendleton.

Mrs. Peterson was a member of United Church of Christ Congregation. Her family and her church were the most important to her.

Albert Lloyd Fetsch

Albert Lloyd Fetsch, 82, of Pendleton, died Friday, March 22, 1996, at his home after a lengthy battle with cancer.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, April 6, 1996 at 3 p.m. at the First Christian Church, 215 N. Main St., Pendleton. Disposition was by cremation.

Mr. Fetsch was born April 14, 1913, at Grants Pass to Emily and Karl Fetsch. The Fetsch family consisted of 10 siblings; all predeceased Mr. Fetsch. The family moved to Salem when Mr. Fetsch was two years old.

Mr. Fetsch left Salem at age 14 and came to Eastern Oregon, settling in the Heppner and Spray area. He worked with canner horses and farmed with horses while growing up. He later became a wheat farmer in the Heppner and Pendleton areas, retiring in 1979.

Mr. Fetsch met and married Edna O. Rauch in August 1938. Mrs. Fetsch died in October, 1990. In December 1990, he married Irene C. Willard, also of Pendleton.

Mr. Fetsch rode and raced in the relay races at the Heppner and Pendleton rodeos. He helped construct and was a longtime member of the Hope Lutheran church in Heppner. He served on the ASCS Board and the Heppner Fair and Rodeo Board. He served as

Heppner parade grand marshal in 1989. He was a 54-year member of the BPOE in Heppner and Pendleton and was a member of FOE #28. He also participated and belonged to the Heppner Wranglers Riding Club.

Mr. Fetsch was an avid hunter and fisherman. He also rode motorcycles, bowled and liked pinocle and dancing.

Survivors include his wife, Irene, at home; sons, Larry D. Fetsch of Enid, Oklahoma and Robert L. Fetsch, Pendleton; daughter Marlene Currin, Heppner; six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Step-children are Melvina Adolf, Bozeman, Montana, Gwyneth Kroiss, Colville, Washington, Brenda Walter, Kettle Falls, Washington, David Willard, Connell, Washington, Mavis Willard, Pendleton; 12 grand-children and four great-grandchildren.

Campbell files for state senate position

Former Grant County judge Kevin Campbell has filed with the Secretary of State seeking election to the State Senate from District 28.

Campbell, a Democrat, currently operates Kevin M. Campbell Consulting Services, Inc. A native of Kimberly, he graduated from Monument High School in 1969 and received his bachelor's degree in business management from the University of Portland in 1973.

He worked as a rancher for his father, Tom Campbell, from 1980-1984. Campbell then owned and operated Howard Mercantile in Kimberly from 1984-1988.

Campbell served as county judge from 1989-1995. In addition to serving as county judge, he was a board member and served as president of the Association of Oregon Counties. He currently serves as a board member for the Oregon Youth Conservation Corps, Northeast Oregon Area Health Education Center (AHEC), the Oregon AHEC Program Advisory Committee and the Oregon State Aeronautics Advi-

sory Committee.

Campbell got his start in local government as a board member and chair of the Monument Soil and Water Conservation District and as budget committee chair for the Monument School District in the early 1980s. He later served as vice chair of the Oregon Soil and Water Conservation Commission, chair of the Oregon Solid Waste Regional Policy Commission and as a member of the Oregon Transportation Policy Committee.

Campbell has filed a voluntary limitation of campaign expenditures which allows contributors to qualify for allowable Oregon income tax credits for contributions to his campaign.

"I am well prepared to represent this district in the Oregon

Senate," said Campbell. "I have consistently been a strong advocate for rural communities and believe that the health of Oregon is directly dependent on the sustained vitality of its rural communities."

Campbell and his wife, Karen, currently live in Canyon City. They have two sons,

Brian, 17, and Nathan, 14. Karen has worked as a registered nurse at Blue Mountain Hospital in John Day since 1980.

District 28 is currently represented by Greg Walden (R-Hood River) who recently announced plans not to seek reelection in next November's election. The district includes all of Baker, Grant, Crook, Wheeler, Gilliam, Sherman, Hood River, the majority of Morrow, Wasco and portions of Clackamas and Multnomah counties.

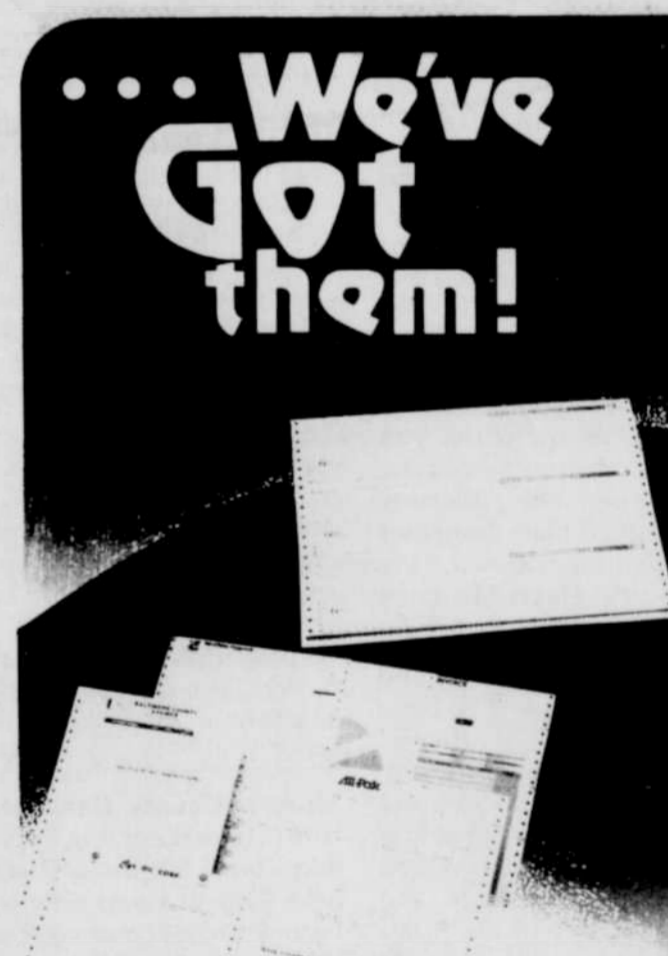
