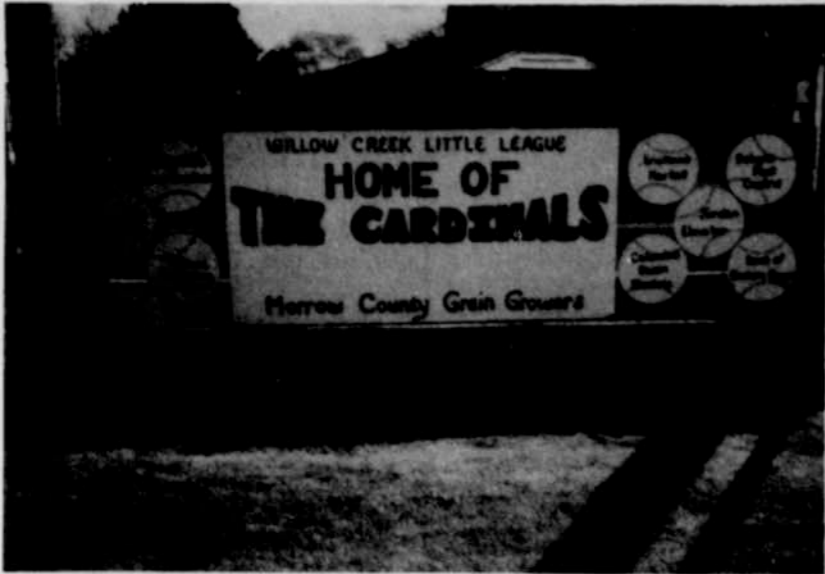


Ione Little League sign refurbished

Medical scholarship available

A scholarship is available to students enrolled in an accredited program in the state of Oregon to become a primary care physician, nurse practitioner, physician's assistant or nurse midwife.

To qualify for this scholarship, students must live in a federally designated Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) in Oregon and be sponsored by a non-profit group in their community. The students must also agree to

return to their community after completing their education and practice there for a minimum of two years. This program is designed to help HPSA communities meet their health professional needs.
