DA's Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's office in Heppner reports handling the following business during the past month:

April 19: Nolan Douglas McClatchy, 29, Milton-Freewater, was convicted of criminal conspiracy to commit burglary II, criminal conspiracy to commit aggravated theft and two counts of conspiracy to commit unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. The conviction stems from a burglary of the Morrow County Grain Growers in Lexington on October 20, 1995. McClatchy was ordered to serve eight months in the Oregon State Penitentiary, pay \$32,861 in restitution and submit to evaluation and residential treatment for drug abuse on release from the penitentiary. McClatchy was also convicted of escaping from the district court and ordered to serve an eight months' sentence to run concurrently;

Andrew E. Burt, 17, Heppner, previously remanded to adult court, was convicted of criminal trespass I and ordered to serve 30 days in the county jail in two 15-day increments;

May 2: Tyson Lynn Doolin, 19, and Aaron Alexander Anello, 17, both from the Kelso-Longview, WA, area, were convicted in adult court of armed robbery and kidnapping I. Doolin was tried as an adult and Anello as a juvenile under Oregon's new Ballot Measure 11, which allows for prosecution of juveniles in adult court for certain crimes, including armed robbery and kidnapping.

Doolin and Anella kidnapped Brett Vernon Thomas, a graduate student at Washington State en route to California looking for a job. Thomas picked up Doolin, Anello and two girls, Michele Rae Kell and Laura Ann Leduc, both 18 and also from the Kelso-longview area. Dooling pulled a pistol which he held to the victim's head, took \$200 and Thomas' pickup. They dumped Thomas off two miles south of I-84 on highway 74.

The two girls were convicted of conspiracy to commit the unauthorized use of motor vehicle. They were not charged with the other crimes because they were locked in the back of the pickup during the incident. Sentencing has tentatively been set for June 20 or when the pre-sentence investigation is completed.

Janet B. Griffin, Irrigon, was charged with contempt of court for failure to pay child support. After a hearing Griffin was ordered to serve 30 days in the county jail.

James Howard Stark, 30, Irrigon, charged with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle and unlawful possession of a firearm, failed to appear for a jury trial May 2. A bench warrant was issued for

his arrest.

Clayton Robert Shuman, 25, Irrigon, was convicted of driving while revoked. he was fined \$550 and ordered to pay assessments. A 30-day jail sentence was suspended on the condition that he commit no crime during a two-year probationary period.

Tree give-away May 17

The Morrow Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) will hold its annual free tree give-away at the Pettyjohn Building parking lot on Friday, May 17, from 8 a.m.-noon. An assortment of ponderosa pine, Douglas-fir and a limited supply of Englemann spruce will be dispersed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Morrow SWCD organizes the dispersal of these excess trees each year in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service. "Trees provide shade, windbreaks and wildlife habitat as well as minimize soil erosion," said a SWCD news release. "Take advantage of this opportunity and plan on planting a few trees this spring to enhance your property."

Rodeo festivities will begin Friday evening, May 24, when the first dance of the weekend will be held in the Spray High School gym. Music will be provided by Old Spice from Redmond.

Following the Friday night dance, the Buckaroo Breakfast, sponsored by the Wheeler County Fair court, will be held from midnight to noon at the school cafeteria.
