School board approves staffing

The Morrow County School Board, at their regular meeting Monday, May 13, approved new staffing for 1996-97 as recommended by the administration and budget committee. The board approved an \$816,200 budget April 29 to fund the new staffing positions.

New staffing includes the following: A.C. Houghton Elementary-three 3 1/2 hour educational assistants; Sam Boardman Elementary-two teachers, five full-time ed assistants, one 3 1/2 hour custodian, one dean of students; Columbia Middle School-three teachers, one 3 1/2 hour custodian, one vice-principal/dean of students; Heppner Elementary-one full-time ed assistant, one 3 1/2 hour ed assistant; Heppner High School/Ione High School-1/2 position school to careers teacher, 1/2 time alternative school teacher; special education-two full-time ed assistants; English as a Second Language-one full-time teacher Boardman, one full-time teacher Irri-gon, three full time ed assistants Boardman, three full-time ed assistants Irri-gon; District-one assistant superintendent, one tech troubleshooter.

The board hired Kevin Fry, currently dean of students at Riverside High School, as principal of Columbia Middle School, for the 1996-97 school year, replacing current principal Don Holes, who has accepted a position with another school district.

In other business, the board: -heard a report from Superintendent Chuck Start that the 1996-97 school lunch prices will remain the same as this year; -approved the transfer of ownership of the old Irrigon School to the city of Irrigon; -heard a request from Ann Murray, Heppner, to support improvement of the Heppner school music program;

-learned that the district has received the final State Standards Report and that the district is in compliance in all areas;

-accepted the low bid of \$16,512 from Allstott-Gentry Construction, Heppner, for a metal roof on the district office gym;

HEPPNER RANGER DISTRICT PROPOSES FAR SIDE SALVAGE

The Heppner Ranger District of the Umatilla National Forest is considering the Far Side Salvage, located in Morrow, Grant, and Wheeler counties. This sale would salvage blown down trees and trees infested with Western pine beetle along 320 miles of open and seasonal open forest roads. The purpose is to recover economic value and impede further tree mortality caused by this beetle. Approximately 90 Mbf of wood products will result from this sale. Only dead and dying trees would be harvested and no new permanent road would be constructed. This sale would have an identifiable salvage component, and as such would be exempt from administrative appeal (Public Law 104-19).

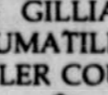
