MCHD plans town hall meetings

Morrow County Health District administrator Kevin Erich announced that the district will hold another series of town hall meetings in early June. The meetings will be co-sponsored by Eastern Oregon State College's Regional Services Institute (EOSC/RSI). According to Erich, the board decided to seek EOSC/RSI assistance because health care services in Morrow County have become such a volatile issue, particularly in recent months.

"We've reached a critical point and upcoming decisions will affect our future tremendously," he said. "The board believes EOSC/RSI will bring an impartiality to the decision-making process that can benefit us all." The town hall meetings will provide information about district services and give the public an opportunity to ask additional questions.

Town hall meetings are scheduled as follows: Tuesday,

June 4-Irrigon City Hall, 7 p.m.; Wednesday, June 5-Riverside High School in Boardman, 7 p.m.; Monday, June 10-St. Patrick's Senior Center in Heppner, 7 p.m.; Tuesday, June 11-Morrow County School District Office in Lexington, 7 p.m.; Wednesday, June 12, Lone City Hall, 7 p.m.

After the meetings, EOSC/RSI will conduct a random sampling survey of approximately 850 registered county voters. The number of voters selected from each zip code will be proportionate to its percentage of total county population. To ensure objectivity, Erich said EOSC/RSI will manage the mail-in survey and compile all results. He added that results will be used to assist the board in determining the future of county health care services, including whether or not to maintain a county-wide health district and which proposed district improvements should be implemented.
