Maryhill admission free to Morrow Co.

Maryhill Museum of Art invites residents of Morrow County to visit free during July. People who reside in Morrow, Gilliam, Grant and Wheeler counties in Oregon and Jefferson, Lewis and San Juan counties in Washington, need only present their driver's license and receive complimentary admission during July.

This is the fourth year the museum has offered this incentive to its neighbors. "Summer is a great time to visit the museum and the Columbia Gorge," said Josie De Falla, director. "This is our way of adding to the fun and pleasure of traveling."

Visitors in July will view the 50th anniversary of the internationally acclaimed "Theatre de la Mode." This "enchanted" exhibit of fifty-seven elaborately costumed one-third human size mannequins, in dramatically lighted stage sets, features the "haute couture" of 1946 Paris. The collection has not been shown at Maryhill since 1988.

Additional July exhibits include two from the museum's 1996 Contemporary Northwest Artists Series: "Cloud Scapes" by Pat Fridell and "Island

Poles" by Steven Jensen.

Seattle artist Fridell creates contemporary paintings focused on the sky. "Light plays a big part in my selection of subject," Fridell says. "It's so gray here (in Seattle) most of the time that when the sun comes out, it's always a special occasion."

Jensen, also from Seattle, uses a subtractive method of carving wood to create contemporary exotic forms of linear intensity. His exhibit will open July 18.

On July 25, a lecture about World War II stolen art by Dr. Gordon Gilkey will be held at 7 p.m. An Oregon Ballet Theatre mini-performance at 8 p.m. will emphasize French forms of dance. A limited number of tickets are available at \$12 for the evening lecture and performance. Advance reservation are recommended.
