PUBLIC NOTICE BIG GUNS EA

The Heppner Ranger District of the Umatilla National Forest is in the process of conducting an Environmental Assessment for two salvage sales and a commercial thin (Pinto Salvage, Uppity Salvage, Mallory Commercial Thin) in Morrow County. Upon review of these project areas, the District decided to combine them under one EA in order to better disclose potential cumulative effects during analysis.

The Big Guns EA project proposes to harvest 3.0 MMBF across 950 acres. Of this, 280 acres would be salvage of dead trees and 670 acres would be commercially thinned to reduce overstocking and convert stands to the open, park-like ponderosa pine stands described in the Historic Range of Variability.

FY1996-97 LODGEPOLE PINE AND MIXED SPECIES PRECOMMERCIAL CHAINSAW THINNING USDA Forest Service Umatilla National Forest Heppner Ranger District Morrow County, Oregon

On June 24, 1996, Heppner District Ranger, Delanne Ferguson, made a decision to implement the 1996-97 Lodgepole Pine and Mixed Species Precommercial Chainsaw Thinning on the Heppner Ranger District. Precommercial thinning is needed to facilitate tree growth and maintain vigor within 456 acres of plantations and naturally regenerated harvest units, and on 1730 acres where dense seedlings and saplings have grown under mature trees outside of harvest units. Trees will be cut by hand using chainsaws. Trees less than 1 foot in height or greater than 8 inches DBH will not be cut.

The Decision Memo and associated project file are available upon request from the Heppner Ranger District, P.O. Box 7, Heppner, OR 97836.

This decision is not subject to appeal pursuant to Forest Service regulations at 36 CFR 215.8(a)(4).

THE MORROW COUNTY COURT will hold the following hearing of public interest on Wednesday, July 10, 1996, at 10:00 a.m. at the North Morrow Annex Building in Irrigon.
