

## Be skeptical of calls

If you get a call for someone who wants to come to your house and tell you what to do in case of a chemical accident at the Umatilla Army Depot, county officials say you should be skeptical.

Geoff Tyree, public information officer with Morrow County Emergency Management, says no one from the county or state Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program is calling people, and no one from the Army is either. And nobody has told government officials they were planning to offer the service to depot-area residents. "We'd like to hear what residents are being told, because we're responsible for protecting the public in the unlikely event of a depot emergency," said Tyree.

A senior citizen in Irrigon received a call from a woman who said she'd like to come to the senior citizen's home to explain what residents should do in case of a nerve gas leak at the depot. The caller did not identify herself or ask for money.

The Irrigon resident was skeptical, took the woman's number and hung up. She then reported the call to the city mayor. The Morrow County Sheriff's Department is investigating the call. Senior citizens centers in Morrow and Umatilla counties have been alerted.
