Dawn will be a senior at Lone High School this fall. She is a three-year member of the Future Business Leaders Association. She has played an active role on the Lady Cardinals varsity volleyball and basketball teams as a member of the 1994 state volleyball championship team and the 1996 state championship basketball team.

This summer she is working part-time as a housekeeper for Jerry and Lisa Rietmann. For fun and relaxation, she watched daytime talk shows on t.v.

For parade and rodeo duties, Dawn will be riding her 12-year-old dapple gray Arabian mare, G-Mistra. Seven years of 4-H horse clubs helped the vivacious royal learn to ride and care for her four-legged partner. The princess has also participated in 4-H cooking clubs and the St. Patrick's Lamb Cook-off in Heppner.

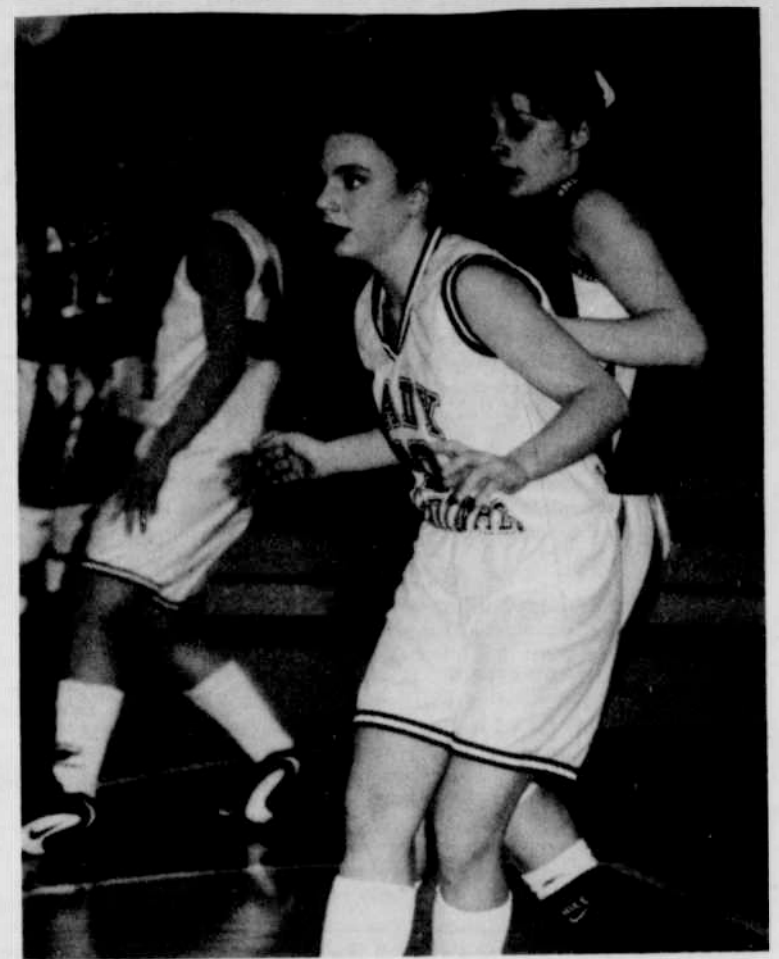

Area students include: Hermiston: Nina K. Tucker, college of agriculture; Lexington: Brent Sheirbon, college of business;

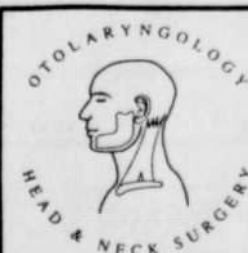
Pendleton: Ryan Adelman, college of engineering.
