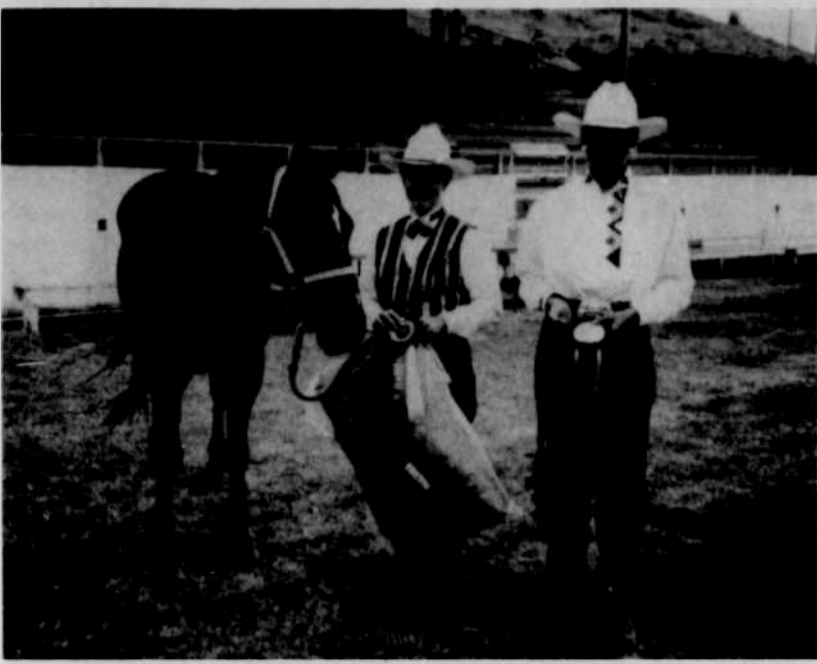


## Open Horse Show winners announced

## Les Schwab Steer Classic, Aug. 23

The Les Schwab Steer Classic, in its fifth season at the Oregon State Fair, is sure to be a big hit again in 1996. The Classic, a finished, non-terminal, market steer show, has been the most popular spectator show of the livestock department and the fair is anticipating another exciting contest this year, said a fair news release.

Open to all breeds, the Steer Classic will be held on Friday, Aug. 23 in the beef show ring. Entries will be accepted until noon, Aug. 23. Entry fee is \$50, which is non-refundable. Weigh-in will start at 8 a.m. on the day of the show.

Six awards will be presented and the total guaranteed jackpot is \$2,500. The champion steer will receive \$1,000; reserve champion \$600; third place \$360; fourth place \$270; fifth place \$180; and sixth place \$90. The jackpot may increase depending on the number of entries received.

The winning steers will be selected based upon the animal's ability to meet today's consumer standards. These standards include general appearance, lean-to-fat ratio, muscle distribution, overall composition, structural soundness and size.

## People for the Pool meet

The People For the Pool, a group dedicated to help raise funds for the proposed swimming pool in Heppner, decided at their July 29 meeting to continue fund raising efforts for a proposed therapy pool, which would adjoin the basic swimming pool.

People for the Pool have raised \$68,674, which is not enough to fund both a therapy pool and a building to house the therapy pool. The group is still undecided as to whether they will fund a shell to house the therapy pool now and pay for construction of the therapy pool itself later, or wait for construction until they have enough money for the building and the therapy pool together.

People for the Pool are in agreement that the therapy pool should continue to be a part of the swimming pool plan and reiterated benefits of such a pool, such as aerobic classes, physical therapy and possibly for group parties and special occasions.

Last year, voters approved funding for Willow Creek Park District (WCPD) for construction of a swimming pool and bathhouse and operational funds for three years.

WCPD Board has stressed that bond monies are for construction of a basic pool.

Pool construction, however, is on hold until circuit court Judge Rudy Murgo decides whether to allow certain petitioners to withdraw from Willow Creek Park District to avoid paying taxes to support the pool construction and operation.

WCPD proposes to build the pool on the Heppner-Lexington Highway coming into Heppner. The most recent proposal calls for a six-lane pool, which would allow for swim team competition.
