

Mustangs win in an overtime thriller, 12-6

The Heppner Mustangs used a tenacious defense and a timely offense to slip past the Joseph Eagles Friday night, Aug. 30, on the road.

Quarterback Brian Koffler hit senior Jeff Watkins with a 25 yard touchdown pass on the second play from scrimmage in overtime for a 12-6 victory.

The Mustang offense started slowly with only one first down in the first half and turned the ball over twice on interceptions by Joseph's Kevin Miller.

Although the Mustang defense had its back to the goal

line, they came up with answers to every Joseph threat in the first half. Senior linebackers Brent Gunderson and Justin Matteson, along with cornerback Eric Schonbachler and junior defensive end Tim Sumner made big plays every time the Eagles had a scoring opportunity.

Heppner got on the board first on a 12 yard touchdown run by running back Travis Wilhelm. The score capped a five-play, 28 yard drive after Joseph punted out of their end zone.

The Eagles, favorites to win the Wapiti League, stormed back on their next possession with a 10-play 70 yard scoring drive to knot the score.

After a penalty, the Eagles went for a two-point conversion that was unsuccessful.

The balance of the fourth quarter was back and forth before the overtime score won the game for Heppner.

Statistics favored Joseph, who outgained the Mustangs with 34 carries for 116 yards, compared to Heppner's 44 rushes for 65 yards. Wilhelm led Heppner with 43 yards on seven carries, including the touchdown.

Heppner quarterback Koffler completed four out of 15 passes for 53 yards, with two interceptions. Eagle quarterback Josh Martin was eight for 24 for 134 yards, with one interception.

Heppner hosts cross county rival, the Riverside Pirates, Friday night, Sept. 6, at the Morrow County Fairgrounds at 7:30 p.m. The Mustangs will be defending their county championship after defeating Riverside last year in non-conference action.

Hal Dinkins

William H. "Hal" Dinkins, 71, of Heppner, died Thursday, August 29, 1996, at Pioneer Memorial Hospital in Heppner.

A time of remembrance will be held from 4-7 p.m. on Wednesday, September 4, 1996 at the family home, 145 Sage Hill Drive in Heppner.

Mr. Dinkins was born March 12, 1925, at Taskee, MO., to Byron and Mabel Simpson Dinkins. He attended school at Greenville, MO., and Williams-ville, MO. He attended college at Oregon State University in Corvallis, the University of Missouri and graduated from Lewis and Clark College in Portland. He returned to the University of Missouri where he earned a master's degree in economics.

On May 4, 1947, he married Joyce Forkner at Multnomah, OR.

He served in World War II and during the Korean Conflict and continued in the military and at the same time attended Columbia University, where he earned a master's degree in political science. He began teaching at West Point Military Academy, then attended the Command and General Staff College at Ft. Leavenworth, KS., and received an assignment as an assistant military attaché to the American Embassy in Mexico City. He retired as a Lieutenant Colonel and moved to Alaska where he taught at Eielson Air Force Base and the University of Alaska, both at Fairbanks. He came to Heppner in 1993.

Mr. Dinkins was a member of the Heppner ELks Lodge, Willow Creek Country Club and Northwest Steelheaders.

While at Fairbanks, he was active with the Northern Alaska Environmental Center.

He enjoyed hunting, fishing and golfing.

Survivors include his wife, Joyce, at the home; daughters, Cynthia Brown of Fairbanks, and Betty Barstow of Albuquerque, NM.; and five grandchildren.
